Mrs. Hatsu NAKAGAWA, Reg. No. 11529,
Ocean Falls, B.C. now Slocan Extension, B.C.

We submitted the above claim to Mrs. NAKAGAWA for payment and are now in receipt of her reply through the Supervisor of the B.C. Security Commission at Slocan, where she is located, definitely denying the claim.

We quote from the Supervisor's letter as follows:

"The above named woman has received a letter from the Claims Department of the Custodian's office dated December 29th, stating that there is a claim lodged with the Custodian against her in the sum of \$40.00 by Dr. Harold H. Caple.

Mrs. Nakagawa claims that she has never until this time heard of Dr. Caple nor did she receive any medical attention whatsoever in this country prior to evacuation."

This is quite an unusual case, in view of the fact that the Declaration filed covering this claim shows her registration number 11529, which is the exact registration number on her card with the Custodian. The previous location, the present location, and the registration number that you have given are identical with those of our records in regard to this party. And yet she makes a definite denial of the claim.

Perhaps you will indicate how these particulars, as given by Dr. Caple, were obtained, in view of the attitude she is taking.

We shall await your comments so that we may investigate further.
