This morning, I have red ived a letter from my brother. In it he writes his property is in Custodian's hands and the Gustodian notified him that the name of the owner of the property is still registered as Kamekichi Yoshida--my father's name--wheres my brother's name is Kanichiro Yoshida. The Custodian asked him the reason shy it is so, and advised him to prove that he is the rightful successor to the property and settle the matter up as soon as possible.

About thirty-five years are my father bought four and one/quarter acres of land on No.9 Road, Steveston and built a house on it. Our family lived there since then continuously up to the evacuation last Summer. The present address is No.122 Steveston Highway, Steveston.

My father died about ten years ago. So immediately after his death, my brother should have succeeded the property through legal procedures, but owning to his carelessness and ignorance of legal procedures, he neglected it for such a long time. And now the trouble comes up.

Since my mother died about a year ago, my brother and I are the only rightful successors to the property and I have no intention of claiming my right in it, rather I am quite milling and gled that my brother succeeds it. Moreover, as an important witness, I wish to do the best I can to let him have it. As to whether we are the rightful heirs to the property or not, I think it is a simple matter to find it out, the Custofian will werify without any trouble.

Since my father retired from active life some twenty years are, my brother looked after the family and property, and paid the taxes, there is not the alightest doubts about it. This is a very important point in the case. I think, besides myself, all our relatives and friends know quite well about it.

I wish to write a letter of evidence to the Custodian and prove to him that my brother is the only and rightful successor to the property by stating the above reasons. But as my position as a witness is very important in the case, so I wish to write the letter clearly and in proper form so that no troubles or misinterpretations will come out of it. As I have no experience in this kind of thing, besides my knowlidge of English language is not enough for it, I find it difficult to write. I wish you will help me up. Please come up to see me soon.



We have no evidence of any claims against Camericki, but the Tranquille Sanitarium has lodged a claim for services to Chiyoso she entered as a patient in 1934 at the age of 35 years, The nother Chica, was evidently guaranter, and if so, this claim would be chargeoble against the estate of Chiles as well as against Chiyoso and would absorb both interests in Kamekichi's estate, leaving Kanichiro's share only one third, However, Chika's estate was not administered and the claim not pressed at that stage. Incidentally, the Sanitarium clais emounts to \$10,557.00 up to the present. Swidently unaware of Chiyoso's debt to the Senitarium, he was allowed to assign his interest in the estates of his parents to his brother, but so feel that he rightfully owned nothing to assign, and we are requesting funichire to forward a direction to this office to apply Chiyoso's share on this account. Kanichiro's file shows claims against him in the muss of \$273.20 and \$125.00 Illed by two other Japanese. Although no adaission regarding these has been received, it is our practice to hold sufficient somies to cover claims until some definite arrangements have been made. (over)
