

This 49-year old Carpenter from Hanalei, B. C., signed a "No Property" card on the 9th February, 1943.

He was evacuated on the 19th March, 1942.

He declared his wife to be in Japan.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None.

Chattels: This Evacuee declared he had no Chattels but on his application a box of carpenter's tools was shipped to him on the 11th July, 1942, from Fort Washington, B. C.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: Two War Savings Certificates (6 \$5.00) were received (January, 1943) from the Hanalei Shipyard Ltd., through P. A. Ross & Sons, and are held in safe custody (Envelope No. 323).

Bank Accounts: None.

Life Insurance: None.


Accounts Receivable: None.

Liabilities: None.

Funds: None in Custodian's hands.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.
