This man did not sign a declaration to the Custodian at any time, although he was requested to do so numerous occasions.

However, in July, 1942, he wrote that his personal property had been left with Kichinosuke KITAMURA, File No. 10871. He gave no details of what these effects were and although KITAMURA did declare some friends' goods these were quite indistinguishable from his own. We have done nothing further, therefore, with regard to this personal property.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$4.91 received from the Provincial Government as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941. This amount was remitted to him on July 2, 1943.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

We have received your letter of July 3rd and note that your goods were reported by Mr. Kichinosuke Kitamura in his name. Reference to Kichinosuke Kitamura's file shows that he did declare some friends goods but these are quite indistinguishable from those of his own. His own belongings do not appear to be of very much value or have at least been considerably overvalued by him, but he has shown little co-operation in answering our letters and we have contented ourselves with sending him a list of what could be found and advising him that no useful purpose is served by putting fictitious valuations on his effects.

You will quite understand from the above that should Mr. Kichinosuke Kitamura's things later be sold, the entire proceeds will be credited in his name and you will have no claim on this office since you have given us no assistance in identifying what belongs to you.
