Fellow Member:-

As President of your Association, I am writing this to advise you, that owing to war conditions, it is not possible to hold the Annual General Meeting in January or February of this year with any prospect of a representative attendance. As you are aware, more than fifty per cent of our members are in the Interior and unable to attend any meeting held in Vancouver while many others are serving in the armed forces of the Country.

Under these circumstances, I considered it advisable to hold an informal meeting of the members available. Accordingly a meeting was held at 342 Pender Street West, Vancouver, B. C. on Monday, 11th day of January 1943, when there were present, in addition to myself, one director and three other members who were in town at the time. Mr. R. Urquhart and Mr. Walter Smith were also present:

At this meeting, which was in no way considered an Annual General Meeting, verbal reports were given by Mr. Urquhart, our sales manager, Mr. Smither, Accountant, and myself. All members took part in the discussions on the present position of the Association and its members as well as on the report of operations in 1942.

As a result of the discussions, it was unanimously agreed:

- (1) That the Directors and other officers of the Association be asked to continue in office and to conduct the business affairs as heretofore.
- (2) That, in order to keep operating expenses as low as possible, Mr. Urquhart be appointed agent and salesmanager in Vancouver for the 1943 fishing season. Mr. Urquhart accepted the appointment.
- (3) That Mr. Walter Smith be instructed to prepare and submit to the Directors, and Income and Expense Account for the year ended 31st December 1942 and a Balance Sheet as at that date, together with his report thereon. That a copy of the said Accounts and Report, after being approved by two Directors, be mailed to every member of the Association.

Mr. Smith agreed to do this and in due time you will be receiving the financial statements and his report. You should give the report your careful consideration and if you desire any further information or explanation on any items in the accounts of the Association, write direct to Mr. Smith, 342 Pender Street, ^{Victoria B.C.} West Vancouver, B. C. who will be pleased to meet your request.

Appreciating the renewed expression of confidence, I call on all members to show loyalty to our Country, our Association and our members in the armed forces during these difficult times.

As I shall be fishing again this season, the affairs of our Association will be in the hands of Mr. R. Urquhart, in whom we have every reason to place full confidence.

In conclusion:- We may feel sure that the near future will bring bigger and more difficult problems to the fishing industry and, therefore, it is in the member's own personal interest to help keep our Co-operative Association in a strong position. Please bear this in mind at this time.

Dear Mr. Templeton:

Pursuant to your instructions, I have written up the books of your Association from the accounts and records kept at the Wharf offices by Mr. Urquhart and Mr. T. Taguchi, and I have made an examination of the accounts over a period of two years.

I have prepared and submit herewith as part of this report, the following statements as at December 31st 1942: viz:

- (1) Balance Sheet.
- (2) Surplus Account
- (3) Profit & Loss Account for the Year ended 31st of December, 1942.

and I have the following comments to make thereon:

The present Co-operative Association was incorporated in 1940 and it is the successor to Consolidated Cod Fishermen's Association, which had been in existence since 1934 and had accumulated a substantial credit balance in the Surplus Account.

Owing to the dislocation of the business and particularly of office records by the removal of the Japanese from Vancouver, complete records of the 1942 transactions were not available, and I have not been able to find any Balance Sheet prior to the one dated 31st December, 1940 which I prepared as a tentative statement in September, 1941. Owing to an accident in 1942 which sent me to the hospital, Mr. W. H. Brown undertook at short notice, the preparation of the Financial Statements for 1941 and these were submitted to you with a covering letter dated 27th January, 1942. Later the same statements were presented and adopted at the annual general meeting held in January 1942.

Although the Japanese at that time were under orders to leave the coast, their delegates attended the annual meeting.

My recent examination of the accounts disclosed differences in the Bank accounts which dated back to the 1941 Balance Sheet, consequently, I have had to put through adjusting entries to reconcile the differences and to bring the books into line with Bank Statements.

Also a Victory Bond for \$100, purchased in 1941, and now held by me at your request, does not appear in the assets of the Accounts as at 31st December, 1941, and I can find no record of the transaction in the books of the Association. There is, however, an entry relating thereto in a Pass Book of the Bank of Montreal in the name of the Consolidated Cod Fishermen's Association. Adjusting entries to take care of this and other differences had to be put through the books before I could draw up a Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1942.

In the 1941 Balance Sheet, the Surplus account balance (as at 31st December, 1939) is shown to be \$14,473.82 and this amount included, \$5,402.42, generally referred to in the minutes as a Trust Fund for the benefit of those members who fished for the Association in the 1935 season.

According to the minutes of the Annual General Meeting held January 29 & 30 1942, a resolution was passed at that meeting to the effect that the said amount, \$5,402.42 was to be placed in a Trust Account at the Bank until the annual meeting in 1943. However, at a subsequent meeting of the directors, held in Mr. Ide's offices, at which all directors were present, it was decided to divide the whole of this fund between the 1935 members, reserving \$150 for expenses of distribution. Payments were made as follows:

To 103 Japanese members in 1935	\$4,341.84
To 44 Other members in 1935	779.51
	<u>\$ 5,121.35</u>

There was also a distribution of \$4,145.24 from General Surplus to Japanese members, early in 1942, on the basis

of \$41.20 per member. I have not had the opportunity of checking these distributions except by the cancelled cheques.

Subject to the foregoing, I am of the opinion that the Balance Sheet enclosed herewith is properly drawn to exhibit a fair and correct view of the affairs of the Cooperative Association as at 31st December, 1942, accordingly to the books and information given to me,

In today's mail I have your letter dated July 24th enclosing a file of correspondence in connection with an application from the above Co-operative Association for a permit to start a new distributing fish business in Vancouver.

I am returning your file of correspondence herewith and will endeavour to give you as much information as possible. I note the application is signed by J. Templeton. Mr. Templeton was the President of this B.C. Cod Fishermen's Association, which up to 1941 was made up of about 90% Japanese fishermen with only half a dozen white fishermen. When the Japs were interned in 1941 the Association ceased to function as there were very few white fishermen to carry on.

I was told that the few white fishermen remaining have been trying to distribute the funds that were in the hands of the Association while operated by the Japs but that these Japs still hold their shares in the Association and refuse to give them up and therefore it is impossible to disburse the funds that are still on hand.

When Mr. Templeton makes the statement that he wants to carry on the Association for the members who desire to resume operations after the war, it must be assumed that he is referring to the Japs and according to press reports there is not much likelihood of the Japs ever coming back to this Coast and the feeling of the white fishermen in B.C. is very bitter against the Japanese ever returning to the fish business.

This Association has nothing to do with the Fishermen's Union on this Coast and their function prior to 1941 was simply to collect fish from the fishermen in their organization and bring same to Vancouver and sell to the processors who depended upon them for supplies of cod fish and who did all the distributing to the wholesale and retail trade.

If a permit were to be given to this Association to go into the distributing business then it would simply mean that they would take away from the processors who are now depending upon them for a source of supply and leave them without stocks to sell. By giving a permit to the above Association it would not mean any increase in the production of fish but would only handle same through different channels.

Under the policy of equitable distribution this Association is compelled to supply the firms with whom they were doing business during the basic period and if so they will have nothing to sell or distribute to anyone else because any production they might have today is very much less than their production during the basic period.

Under the circumstances I can not see how it is possible to approve of this application and I would therefore suggest that it be turned down. Of course it must be understood that you would not use my name if you accept my recommendation because I have to live with these fishermen on this Coast and can not afford to have them antagonistic toward me. Would appreciate having you advise me what is finally done in this connection.

Notice of Special General Meeting

To the Members:-

Take notice that a Special General Meeting of the members of the above Association will be held at Lund, B. C. on Monday the 21st August, 1944, commencing at 10 o'clock A.M.

The purpose of the meeting is to consider and take all necessary steps to place the Association in a practical working condition and in particular to deal with certain constitutional amendments as listed below and to receive reports and transact any other business which may be considered necessary or advisable.

Please take notice that the following Extraordinary Resolutions will be presented,-

Amendments to the constitution:-

- A. That Rule 23 (1) (b) of the Co-operative Associations Act be adopted as a Rule 79 of the Association. This Rule reads as follows:-

"Where a member is charged with conduct detrimental to the Association, he may be expelled from membership by an Extraordinary Resolution of the Association. The member making the charge shall lodge with the directors full particulars thereof in writing signed by him, and the member charged shall be furnished by them with a copy of the particulars at least two weeks previous to the meeting. The notice calling the meeting shall state that the charge has been made and specify the names of the members concerned."

- B. and by adding as Rule 80 the following,-

"Where a member has not done any business with the Association for a period of over a year, their Directors may, in their discretion, redeem the share of such member, provided, however, that in addition to repaying the member the amount he subscribed for his share, he shall be entitled to receive such proportion of undistributed profits as he might have been entitled to at the time of the transaction of his last business with the Association upon the poundage basis, less whatever might be necessary for Statutory reservations."

The members will also be asked to vote on the proposal to join the Fishermen's Co-operative Federation which is in process of being formed.

Your special attention is called to By-laws 33 to 37 of the Association in which it is stated that "The members of each local Branch, at the annual general meeting of such local branch in each year, elect one of their number for every fifteen members or fraction thereof of such branch, to act as proxies for the members of such branch at meetings of the Association".

Only delegates duly elected by such local Association are entitled to vote at general meetings.

Dear Miss Carroll:

I have received your letter of the 31st ultimo, enclosing private and confidential letter from The Director, Fish and Fish Products (Pacific), to Mr. H. W. Welch of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. This, I take it, is the letter referred to in Mr. Mathieu's telegram of August 1st to which I replied yesterday.

We have no file whatever in connection with the above Association nor at the present time have we any information regarding to it. We have telephoned to the Registrar of Companies at Victoria and have now gained the following information.

The Association was incorporated April 29th, 1940 and annual returns have been made, the last being the annual report filed on January 21st, 1943. The President is listed as being Mr. James Templeton, residing at Quathiaski Cove. The registered office of the Association is the office of Messrs. Morris and MacLennan here in Vancouver. We have asked the Registrar to mail us copies of the annual report nearest to the time of evacuation and also the annual report of January 21st, 1943, above referred to. However, as these have to come from Victoria it may be a day or so before we actually receive these documents.

It is not likely that these reports will supply us with the shareholders of this Co-operative as all that is required for filing annual returns, I believe, are the names of the Officers of the Association. However, when we know who the Japanese officers were at the time of evacuation we can contact them and endeavor to get a list of the shareholders, if this appears to be desirable. There are apparently no physical assets belonging to the Association in the protected area as it would appear that the Co-operative consisted of a group of fishermen disposing of their catch through their

Dear Miss Carroll:

Further to my letter of August 2nd, in reply to your inquiry of July 31st, I have now received from the Registrar of Companies, Victoria, copies of the annual returns of this Association for December, 1941 and 1942. Copies are enclosed for your information.

You will note that these were submitted by Mr. W. H. Smith and I called on Mr. Smith at his office at 342 West Pender Street, Today. The 1941 statement shows that an operating profit of \$72.37 was made for that year and an operating loss in 1942 of \$389.07. The surplus existing previous to this, the report states, was dealt with as follows: That is called the special 1935 surplus was distributed between 103 Japanese and 44 other members. Out of the remaining surplus the Japanese themselves, prior to evacuation, distributed to each Japanese member, \$41.20, and Mr. Smith states that in his opinion this distribution covered fully the amount to which the Japanese were entitled, and that therefore, the Japanese would have no interest in the surplus shown after this distribution, namely \$4655.53 as at December 31st, 1942.

Mr. Smith has supplied me with a list of the Japanese shareholders, a copy of which I am enclosing. His record also shows the names of approximately 90 white shareholders. He also gave me the enclosed notice on a special meeting called for the 21st of August. Mr. Smith believes that a copy of this notice for each individual shareholder has been mailed to Tommy Taguchi and a similar number of copies to Mr. Hideo Fukuyama. These two Japanese are supposed to be two men that the Organization had confidence in and the mailing of the notice to these two persons by the President is thought to be sufficient notice for calling this special general meeting.

In view of the fact that the only interest the Japanese

appear to have in the Association is a share interest, I do not see that we have any responsibility in this matter. There are no physical assets and Mr. Smith is correct in his statement that they have received their proportion of undistributed profits, or should there be any further undistributed profits to which they are entitled, Clause B of the notice calling the meeting indicates that it would be paid to the Japanese members.

It is my understanding that no further benefits to the Japanese shareholders can accrue to them while they are away, as distribution of surplus profits is on the basis of pounds of fish which the members contributed. As regards the continuance of the operations of this Association, in view of the majority of its members not being in a position to fish, it would appear to me that their production would not be sufficient to supply the quantities which they formerly sold to fish companies here, and to whom I believe they would be obligated to do business up to quantities supplied during the basic period. Their former operation was merely that of collecting the fish produced by its members, transporting it to Vancouver and selling it to fish companies here.

The matter of whether this Association should now be permitted to process and distribute fish is of course a matter for the Maritime Prices and Trade Board, but it would appear to be a new departure from the type of operations previously carried on.

MEMORANDUM

RE: B. C. Cod Fishermen's Co-op Association

You had some correspondence with Ottawa in connection with this matter the early part of August last, and in view of this I think you should know of the developments.

Mr. J. A. Templeton, President, called at the office yesterday and left with me a copy of the resolution passed on the 21st of August, 1944, also a statement compiled by their Accountant, indicating that \$5.15 was the amount due each member. As I understand it, there are about 90 Japanese interested in the Association, so that on this basis they would be entitled to, roughly, \$450.00. Mr. Templeton wanted to leave a cheque and obtain a release of the Japanese interests. I pointed out that the Custodian would not be prepared to accept the amount unless we had a Chartered Accountant go over the books and check their Accountant's Statements; also that before such a release was granted, we would want to obtain the approval of the Advisory Committee.

I further pointed out that according to their own statement, the Association made a profit up to 1941, and after the Japanese left there was a loss in 1942 and 1943, amounting to \$583.26, with which they were now charged.

Mr. Templeton had a letter from Konosuke Taguchi, the Treasurer, copy of which is attached. I suggested that he should submit a statement to Taguchi and forward us a copy of any reply he may receive relative to acceptance of \$5.15. I informed him that we would not necessarily be governed by any decision that Taguchi and his Committee arrive at. There the matter stands.

Resolution and the Statement referred to will be found on the file, and I would be glad to discuss this matter with you further upon your return from Winnipeg.

MEMORANDUM TO: MR. P. G. SHEARS

Will you be good enough to place this case on the agenda for the next regular meeting of the Advisory Board to be held at New Westminster on Friday.

Information concerning an interview had with Mr. Templeton is contained in my memo to you dated September 15th, 1944.

Mr. Carr, Acting Secretary of the Association, called at the office this morning and left the following letter from the Association:

"Confirming conversation with your office a few days ago regarding settlement which the above Association proposed to make with its Japanese members, this matter was taken up with your office in September last by Mr. James Templeton, President of the Association, whose address is Quathiaski Cove, B. C.

At that time, statements outlining the proposed settlement and letters from the former Japanese directors, were submitted to you by Mr. Templeton, giving the Japanese approval of the proposed settlement.

We are now awaiting the approval of your office before issuing check for the amount due the Japanese members, and as we are anxious to have this matter cleared up with the least possible delay, would very much appreciate your giving the matter your early attention".

Mr. Carr was informed that we had not yet received the approval of the Committee and he promised to bring in a copy of the letter from TAGUCHI. This has now been received and is as follows:

"Dear Mr. Jimmy Templeton:

Thank you for your letter dated Sept. 15th in which you expressed satisfaction in the work we are doing.

I have also received the financial reports and have greatly understand in which I will give notices to all the Japanese members.

As I have inform to you, it will be extremely difficult for you to locate the present address of the member of all Japanese origin who are scattered over Canada. Therefore, if you will send to my brother, Torasaburo Taguchi, Ninto Mines, B. C. undistributed profits and subscription on the shares for the said members in bulk with 113 Japanese members' name list, I will take full responsibility to have it properly distributed to every member. Therefore, please send it immediately.

Gentlemen:

Referring to our letter of the 27th ultimo, we wish to advise that this matter was brought to the attention of the Rural Advisory Committee on Japanese Properties on the first instant. The Advisory Board has suggested that we should obtain an expression of opinion, in writing, from the Japanese members.

It was noted that the members are being charged with losses, amounting to \$583.26, that occurred subsequent to the evacuation of the Japanese. The members of the Committee, under the Chairmanship of His Honor Judge Whiteside, realizing that it will not likely be possible to obtain approval from 100% of the Japanese members, and no doubt if we present a report indicating that the majority approve acceptance of your offer, we will be advised to accept and issue the necessary clearance to you.

Konosuke Taguchi, in his letter to you under date of September 30, 1944, advised that he would communicate with the Japanese, and it may be advisable to have him obtain their approval rather than to have the letters sent from this office to the individual members.

We will gladly co-operate with you in every possible way and would appreciate an early reply to the suggestion herein.
