Further to Mr. Wright's letter dated January 21st.

In a recent interview with Mr. Collins he read from a letter he had received from Mr. Macnamara in which you were quoted. I asked Mr. Collins for a copy and have just received same.

There is one point on which we are not quite clear, you are quoted as saying:

"If the Internee has definitely advised the Custodian that he does not wish his assets used to support his family etc."

This raises the point as to whether we should ask the Internee for his approval. We feel that his assets should be used for the support of his dependents without his having been invited to express his opinion in regard to same and that only if he raises an objection would we then review the case on its merits as you suggest.

Mr. Wright feels that there will be an increasing tendency on the part of internees to refuse consent.

I am enclosing copy of part of Mr. Macnamara's letter to Mr. Collins, referred to above.

Dear Mr. McPherson:

On November 17th, 1943, we paid to The B. C. Security Commission, at their request, the sum of \$293.53, from the Internee's funds with us to cover funds advanced by The B. C. Security Commission for the maintenance of the Internee's wife and family.

At the same time we wrote the Internee asking his wishes in connection with The B. C. Security Commission's request that his wife and family be supplied with \$35.00 monthly from his funds for maintenance.

He replied on November 20th, 1943 as follows:

"I will refer this matter to my wife, then will notify my decision".

No further word has been received from the Internee.

On November 27th, 1943, and December 23rd, 1943, we sent remittances of \$35.00 each to Mrs. Kumamoto for maintenance.

We are now in receipt of a letter from Mrs. Kumamoto dated the 17th, a copy of which we attach, saying that she will not accept maintenance from her husband's funds, and informing us not to pay the \$293.53 claimed by The B. C. Security Commission.

Your letter of October 9th requests us to kindly file form D covering the above policies. Reference to our file shows that form D for both policies have already been filed.

In connection with the Kumamoto case the report was filed with the Custodian's Office in Ottawa under date of April 1, 1942. Mr. F.X.A. Biron, in acknowledging the report, stated that the matter had been referred to the Custodian's Office in Vancouver. On the same date as Mr. Biron acknowledged the report, Mr. Edgar T. Read of your Office wrote us asking us to file form D with the Vancouver Office. We understand that the matter of filing the report was cleared up at that time and as a matter of fact we have had certain correspondence with your Office on this case, notably a letter of September 29, 1942 signed by Mr. K.W. Wright replying to ours of September 17, 1942, with which we sent the notices of certain premiums due on policies under your control including the Kumamoto policy. Mr. Read's letter gave his file number as 410, but in the heading stated "Re: No. 553 - Jun Kumamoto". We trust this information will enable you to find the copy of the report which Mr. Biron referred to you at the time the report was made by us in duplicate to the Custodian's Office in Ottawa.

A report for policy no. 2,203,724 - Takaoka was drawn up in duplicate also but here the original only was sent to Mr. Biron and a copy was sent to your Office under date of May 1, 1942. Since then we have sent you a premium notice under date of July 6, 1942 and also on June 28, 1943 and furthermore our Vancouver Office forwarded to us a request for the cash surrender value submitted through your Office. We have on file a receipt from C.H. Reed as Cashier dated September 7, 1943 acknowledging the sum of \$146.53.

With the above information you will likely find that your request of October 9, 1943 for form D has been made without knowing that reports have already been filed. We are not filing further reports at the moment but will await your confirmation that the original copies of the reports



This party having been interned, his property, being enemy property, has vested in the Custodian, and this includes his Life Insurance. The Policy, therefore, under the Regulations, cannot be cancelled for non-payment of the premiums. Arrangements to this effect have already been made with the Canadian Life Officers' Association in Toronto some time ago. *As the Custodian's funds are awaiting for his approval of payment*

The general policy agreed upon by the members of the Association was that they would place enemy policies in suspense and if the Custodian had funds available he would endeavour to pay the premiums. If he does not pay the premiums, however, they are not to be accumulated as liens against the policy. The contract itself is to remain in force. Therefore, the policy you refer to cannot be cancelled at this time. If it were cancelled prior to the internment of this party, the Custodian would not be interested.

It was not possible to close with any of them because they did not have enough money to warrant us taking the risk of accepting down payment, although on more than one occasion Mrs. Kumamoto was put out because I would not make such a deal. The only creditor was the landlord. Fortunately, he did not press unduly for his rent. It was a relief, however, to secure an offer for \$550.00 spot cash from Jack Fung a few days ago.

The internee advised that he would accept an offer satisfactory to his wife, and I have Mrs. Kumamoto's approval in writing to this deal. The full amount of \$550.00 has been deposited to this man's credit.
