At the time he was interned he refused to give any particulars relative to his family, to declare any takens or to go to work camp. In the report we received from the M.G.H.P... they state that this now has frequently been a source of annoyance to them and that he is very pro-Japanese. Attached herete you will find copy of a memo I have made for the above file, Bry, Blyasakt called Loday to say that she would be leaving for Japan in a few days and offered to leave the Passbooks for the two accounts, so I accepted, and Mrs. Miyazaki is to send us a letter as soon as she knows her date of departure. As I understand it, these people are to be allowed about \$200.00 each and Mrs. Hiyazaki has admitted carrying \$600.00 which will be more than allowance for her husband and herself. There is over \$1100.00 in the Bank and in view of suggestions unde that those with a surplus are contributing to their countrymen who have not enough, it seems to me that it is our duty to safeguard the interests of the Government although they are not enemies until they board ship. The mere taking of the Passbook does not tie the account, but most of these people believe that without it funds may not be withdrawn. I do not suppose that we can go so far as to motify the Bank but as similar cases may arise I does it advisable to bring this to your attention and you may determine whether the action is right or wrong. I would appreciate suggestions as to how much further we night go. I have given receipts for these books so that it will eventually come out and if any questions are asked by Ottawn, you will have the details. Per:
