





Dear Sir:

Mr. Ken Kitamura has advised us verbally that you desire shipment of certain chattels left by you in Vancouver at the time of your evacuation.

When you registered your assets with the Custodian on August 24, 1942 you declared that you had no property remaining in the Protected Area. It is therefore impossible for us to comply with your present request unless you provide us with complete information as to what you left, where you left it, what you want shipped to you, and when you want it shipped to you.

You are entirely free to make application for shipment of any chattels belonging to you in the Protected Area direct with the local Supervisor of the B. C. Security Commission in Slocan who in turn will forward your request to this office.
