In your letter of March 24, 1944 to this office you filed a claim against Heihiro ICHITANI for \$50.00 for 5 months rent prior to evacuation in 1942. We have submitted this to him at various times without receiving any satisfactory reply.

As we are reviewing your file, please advise if this account has been paid or settled so that our records will be up to date in this respect.

According to our letter to you of the 6th November 1942 we reported as follows:-

"We regret that our Agents were unable to collect the \$30.00 rent owing from Mrs. T. Sugimoto and the \$20.00 from Mrs. K. Nagahara. These two parties stated that they were destitute and were unable to pay the rent up to the time of their evacuation."

Is it possible that the \$50.00 unpaid by these 2 parties is the same \$50.00 that you are claiming from ICHITANI.

We shall be obliged for an early reply to this letter.
