This seems to be Yoshio HATANAKA, Int. 780 who has now returned to Japan. He did not declare any chattels in Varcouver and had evidently lived in West Vancouver for several years prior to evacuation. It would seem probable that another Japanese took over HATANAKA's lease when he went to live in West Van. and never advised the Rental agent when he went to live in West Van. and never advised the Rental agent of the fact. Res HATAVAK A. Y. - 652 Rest Cordove St.

On August 4, 1962, Turner & Heakin, agents for the above property filed a claim against K. HATANAKA, in the amount of \$65.00, being arrears of rest up to August 31, 1942. They stated that the rest was \$8.50 per month which would near that HATANAKA paid his rest up to about the 10th, of January 1942.

Turner & Meakin requested that the chattels then stored on the promises to mayed and this was done on August 24, 1942, as per Inventory No. 214 on file. Mr. Smith who moved the chattels states that they were stored in the Upstairs of 652 East Gordova Street.

Two persons with the initial "Y" HATAWAKA are known to the R. C.H.P.; Toshitaka HATAWAKA - File 1548 - 43 East 5th. - part owner of property at that sadress; Toshio HATAWAKA - Int. 780 - owner of property in West Vancouver where he resided. Furthermore, the R. C. M.P. have no record of anyone with the name HATAWAKA residing at that address.

It is also to be noted that no person of that name appears on the list of persons returning to Japan in November 1941.

The Gity directory gives the following persons as residing at 652 Best Cordova:

MORI, C. and Wife - Files Int. 1393 and Int. 1394 - both returned to Japan in November 1941.

WATANABE, Issue - 7:1e 948 - States that no one of the name of HATANAKA resided at 652 Cordova Street while he was there.

EUGUNOKI, Kinso and Kikumo (wife) - Files 1884 and 11373 - Declared they lived at 652 East Cordova. They also declared that they owed rent and left chattels which appear to coincide almost exactly with the ones moved in the name of HATAMAKA. Both returned to Japan, August 2, 1946. The R. G. M. P. report that they have no record of this man using the name of HATAMAKA or of having any married daughters of that name. Misake KUSUNOKI, daughter of Kinso and Limno, resides in Hamilton, Ontario and is being contacted in an effort to get further information regarding HATAWAKA. Wisake - File

NISHIMURA, C. Possibly Suckichi (other name Nemo) - File 1898. Declared that
he lived at 692 East Cordova. Was asked for information
regarding HATAHAKA in 1943 but did not reply. Information
asked for again on this date.
