I questioned him regarding his interest in the Holly Lodge store.

He informed me that the store belonged to the whole family. It was originally financed by his father and brother Bruce, but the funds borrowed have all been refunded.

Being a family affair, no salaries were paid, and when cash was required for the purchase of food, clothing, etc., it was just taken from the store cash box. This is quite a customary practice in the family system in Japan and I can quite understand the arrangement.

As there are 10 members in the family, I imagine the interest of any one individual member of the family would be comparatively small.
