I was told to inquire with the R.C.M.P. which I did, but last week they wrote me back stating that all radios & cameras were handed over to you and that I should write directly to you concerning this matter.

I have been asked by two different parties about their belongings which they left with the R.C.M.P. when they left the protected area. (We have their receipts)

The first party is in Orono, but he left them together with the lady's who is now in Slocan. (All were registered under Mrs. Quada)

What the first party would like to know is, is it possible to have it in

their possession in Ceram? If this is
impossible, he would like his friend in
Ontario to have his radios & cameras.

The lady too would like his son in
Ontario to have them since it is impossible
to have it in her possession in Slocan.

Please advise me at your earliest
convenience, the best & right way to obtain
them.

Dear Madam:

In reply to your letter of April 11th, we wish to advise that we understand radios and cameras are being released to owners residing outside the Interior housing settlements. Shipment is made through the British Columbia Security Commission, and we suggest that you consult the supervisor in your section in regard to shipment of the cameras mentioned in your letter.

We regret to advise that the three radios in question have already been sold.

As these cameras and radios were turned in by Mrs. Asada, it has been taken that these were her property. We would appreciate receiving from Mrs. Asada the names of the owners of the various articles. This will enable us to credit to the correct accounts the proceeds of the sale of the three radios, and to deal correctly with requests which may be made to the British Columbia Security Commission for shipment of the cameras.

We are having the cameras withheld from sale to enable the owners to arrange shipment.

The above-indicated woman turned in to the R.C.M.P. three radios and three cameras. These were listed under RCMP #398. The radios have been sold and the proceeds credited to Mrs. Asada's account.

Letter from Miss Kimiko SAITO, Reg. 00106, File 12645, would indicate that these articles were not the property of Mrs. Asado solely, but that some other person was the owner of certain of the radios and cameras in question.

Miss Saito's letter indicates that the owners wish, if possible, to have their cameras returned to them. Would you, therefore, hold the three cameras listed under RCMP #398, until the owners have had an opportunity to arrange for shipment.

These cameras were released to the Custodian in January, along with the radios, which were sold by auction January 27, 1944.


We attach hereto signed Application Forms for three cameras, and R.C.M. Police Receipts sent in by the above-noted to the Custodian, who forwarded them on to us.
