PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 12670

May 23, 1947

Re: Kumaichi NEGISHI, Reg. No. 03172

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on September 1, 1942. He was evacuated on October 28, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a kitchen table, a cabinet and a bureau, which were to be left in his room at 451 Powell Street. A memo on file under date of October 30, 1942, states that NEGISHI had informed Mr. Trumbill of this office that anything remaining unsold would be taken with NEGISHI on his evacuation. However, a kitchen cabinet and a table, as well as some Japanese netting were found and identified as the property of this man. These items were sold for the net sum of \$4.81, which has been credited to the account of Kumaichi NEGISHI. It is noted that originally the goods sold were identified as the property of Mrs. Kumaichi NEGISHI, but as Mrs. NEGISHI declared no property while her husband declared goods similar to those sold, the funds were placed in the husband's account.

NEGISHI declared one net (6/40 x 6 1/2 x 50) left with B. C. Packers. No nets tagged with the name of this man were found by this office in any of the net houses around Vancouver. Prior to the repatriation of NEGISHI he informed Mr. Peters of this office that he had left a net and cork lines with B.C. Packers Ltd. Rivers Inlet, B.C. We wrote B. C. Packers Ltd. in regard to this net and line, but have received no reply. In view of the fact that the fishing companies generally purchased or sold on behalf of the fishermen any nets, lines or other equipment left at the canneries, and that the fishing companies have been put to considerable trouble in connection with goods left behind by evacuated persons, it appears likely that the lack of a reply from B. C. Packers Ltd. merely means that they have no record of any such nets. If this net had been of value the packing company would undoubtedly have accounted for it as was done in other cases. If the net is still unsold, it would now be of no value in any case.

The vessel "K.N.", New Westminster Lic. #1919, was sold by NEGISHI through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee as shown on Vessel Summary.

No other property is revealed by this file.

This man has reported to this office that he left a net and cork lines at B. C. Packers, Rivers Inlet. We have no record of the disposal of these items.

We believe this man operated a fishing vessel, "K.N.", New Westminster Licence No. 1919, in connection with your Brunswick Cannery, as one "K. Negishi" appears on the list of Japanese fishermen, which you supplied to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, who had been attached to that cannery.

We would be pleased to receive any information you may be able to supply in regard to this net and cork lines.

While checking over your records, if it is not too much trouble, would you please give us information about any fishing gear you may have purchased from any of the Japanese fishermen at Brunswick and Rivers Inlet Canneries, and if any gear was left at these canneries which was not disposed of either by the fishermen or by your company on their behalf, any information you can supply in regard to this will be much appreciated.

We regret having to bother you, but there does not appear to be any other method of getting the required information. The information you have supplied us at various times has been very helpful and we wish to thank you for the trouble you have taken in regard to our inquiries.

For your convenience in replying, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope.

Dear Sir:

Your file with this office has been reviewed, and it is noted that, in your declaration to the Custodian on September 1, 1942, you reported that a kitchen table, a cabinet and a bureau were in your room at 451 Powell Street. When Custodian representative called at that address before your evacuation you informed him that you had sold some things and that the remainder would be taken with you. However, a kitchen cabinet, a table and some matting were later found and were identified to be your property. These were sold at auction for the net sum of \$4.81, which was credited to your account.

In your declaration, you reported a net left with British Columbia Packers Ltd., Vancouver, B. C. As no net identified as your property was found at any of the canneries of that company in the vicinity of Vancouver, it was assumed that this net was among the items which you had sold. You have now informed the Custodian representative at Slocan, that a net and cork lines were left at British Columbia Packers Ltd., Rivers Inlet. We do not know which of the Rivers Inlet canneries of this company these articles were left at, but believe it may be Brunswick. We have written the company in an effort to obtain information, but it will be some time before a reply can be received, and we do not think it will be possible to give you any further information before your departure for Japan.

We see by your file that you were indebted to Ichiji TANAKA for two months rent at \$9.00 a month, at the time of your declaration. As we have no knowledge of this rent having been paid, we assume that it is still owing to Mr. TANAKA. Please let us know if it has been paid.




