He was committed as a result of murdering his wife and three children at 1701 Cedar Street, Vancouver, on November 3, 1919. He was born on October 19, 1882, in Japan and came to Canada in 1900, arriving at Victoria. He had no brothers or sisters. His mother was dead. His father's name was given as Motoichi Sakata.
