We are in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant regarding the ihai which was supposed to be together with the ashes of your father.

We know that an ihai is a wooden tablet on which is inscribed the name of the deceased person. In view of the importance attached to such article, we would like to try to discover it for you, and if you will give us a little assistance, it might enable us to do so. Therefore, in your reply, please state the approximate size of the wooden tablet, also the colour, and write the name of KITANO in Japanese characters as they appeared on the tablet, and also inform us if the tablet was mounted in a wooden base.

A rough sketch of the tablet would perhaps be the best way of describing it to us.

With further particulars from you we will institute a careful search on your behalf.
