GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 13065

Re: Masao MASUDA, Reg.No.05910

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on October 1, 1942. He was evacuated on October 14, 1942. He died at New Denver on September 23, 1943.

In his declaration he stated that he owned no property of any kind in the restricted area.

However, the RCMP reported a radio (RCMP No.640) surrendered by St. Joseph's Oriental Hospital in the name of this man on December 13, 1943. This radio was sold for the net sum of \$18.33, which has been credited to the account of Masao MASUDA. Since the radio was surrendered by St. Joseph's Oriental Hospital it is doubtful if the Japanese owner received a receipt. At any rate since Masao MASUDA is deceased and his father (who apparently was his only living relative in Canada) has been repatriated to Japan there does not seem to be much possibility of obtaining the receipt in the event that the Japanese did have such paper. We are therefore freeing the radio money in this account without the radio receipt.

On December 7, 1943, we received from the Prudential Insurance Company cheque for \$432.54 in full payment of claim under Policy M-4491421 on the life of Masao MASUDA. Cheque was payable to his father. From these funds the funeral expenses of \$60.00 were paid to the B. C. Security Commission on February 25, 1944 on instructions of the father, Hotoi MASUDA, File 1374. The remainder of these funds were remitted to the father and beneficiary.

This file reveals a claim of \$1,656.00 filed by the Tuberculosis Division Provincial Board of Health. The sum of \$18.33 is being remitted to this creditor today to be applied on this claim.

This file reveals no other property or liabilities.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

You will recall that we have written you on various occasions regarding the above property and this is to inform you that in view of the heavy arrears, both as regards principal and interest owing on the property, in reviewing this matter it was quite clear that you had no equity in the property as an independent valuation put a value of \$3000.00 on the property, whereas there is over \$5000.00 outstanding. In order, therefore, to protect your assets, a Quit Claim Deed has been executed by the Custodian Office, and the property has ultimately been disposed of for \$3000.00 so that you are released from the obligation of over \$2000.00 interest that was outstanding. You have now, therefore, no further interest in the property.

There is standing to your credit from rentals, etc. the sum of \$761.91 after taking into consideration the \$150.00 we have paid into the Y. MURAKI account in accordance with your letter. We cannot say exactly what the final amount will be, but probably in excess of the above figure. This brings us to the fact that your late son, Masao MASUDA, has an account against him of \$1656.00 with the Provincial Board of Health, T. B. Division, and a copy of this account is attached. We have little doubt that you would wish to pay as much of this account as is possible and we should be glad, therefore, if you will kindly advise us at the earliest opportunity what we may pay from your account in part settlement of enclosed bill.

With regard to the property - at a later date you will be sent a statement showing adjustments and the final amount credited to your account as at April 30, 1944 - the date on which the property was taken over.

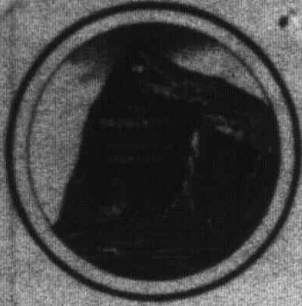
