GENERAL SUMMARY

August 5, 1946.

Re: Tasuo MATSUURA, Reg. No. 05935

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on October 1, 1942, in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However the R.C.M.P. handed to this office a Philco radio surrendered by this man. This was sold and the net proceeds of \$18.33 were credited to his account. As we have received the receipt we are remitting this amount to him today.

The Provincial Board of Health filed a claim for \$1,152.00 against this man. As his credit balance is so small, \$18.33, Mr. J. G. McRae of the office of the Collector of Institutional Revenue advised us on August 2, 1946 to remit the balance to the Japanese.
