No other Personal Property of Kimi NAKAMURA is revealed on the file.


LIABILITIES:

It was also lodged against the husband, Gensaburo NAKAMURA File #5160 and as shown by that file was settled by Agreement with the Board of Health on January 8th, 1946 by the payment through this office of \$79.33 and charged against account of Gensaburo NAKAMURA in full settlement. See requisition #494 this file.

No other claims are revealed against Kimi NAKAMURA on her file.

Dear Sir:

Your favour of November 22nd instance received and contents noted, but I fail to understand the claim laid by Mr. McRae to the amount of \$2706.00 of which \$190.67 was paid, leaving a balance of \$2515.33.

My wife was in St. Joseph's Hospital about 30 months, and it seems their claim amounts to approximately \$90.00 per month for this period. If I am able to pay this amount my wife would not have been left in their care, which I understood is operated as a philanthropic institution, because for \$90.00 I could have placed her in a private nursing home.

At the time my wife entered the institution, I promised to pay \$10.00 per month which was the best I could afford, and Mr. McRae understood that this was done in good faith. When I had to leave for Road Camp on March 10, 1942, I telephoned Mr. McRae of my inability to continue this payment.

As to my credit held by your office, amounting to \$1064.80, I have a number of personal obligations which I must meet, one being to Mr. Sansuke Kawamoto for the amount of \$500.00 at 7% interest and another to Mr. Masao YOSHITAKE, \$300.00 at 7%, former for purchase of our house and latter for purchase of delivery car. I, also have a number of small debts after evacuating to New Denver. I am intending to transfer Victory bonds to Mr. Kawamoto in the near future if he is agreeable to the procedure.

Considering these obligations which must be met in the near future, and the fact that we will be required to leave the project soon to start life anew, I cannot see my way clear to rehabilitate myself and family on what is left after all these debts are paid.

It is not my wish to fail in honoring my obligations, and if you consider some settlement is absolutely necessary, may I suggest the following for complete settlement.

Dear Sir:-

We wrote to you today by another letter regarding Dominion of Canada Bonds for \$500.00 that you have ordered through the Bank of Montreal. Before passing same we checked your file and find that there is a substantial claim against you on account of your wife having been a patient in St. Joseph's Hospital from November 29th, 1939 to May 19th, 1942. The bill for this is \$2,706.00 of which you are reported as having paid \$190.67, leaving \$2,515.33 balance unpaid. Assuming that this account is correct, and against you we called Mr. McKee, Provincial Collector for the Provincial Board of Health by telephone to see what sort of a settlement could be made to liquidate this considerable amount. He was we think, quite considerate and suggested that he would be willing to accept in full settlement of the claim, say one third of the amount of your credit balance with the Custodian.

As you perhaps know, this balance at the present time is \$1064.84. One third of that amount which is \$355.00 would be accepted by him in full payment of the within named account. If you agree that the account is correct and that this basis of settlement is agreeable to you we shall make settlement accordingly.
