Re: Chattels in the care of Mr. Hadley, Hadley Shingle Mill, Minstrel Island

The three Japanese referred to in the attached memorandum reported their chattels left care of K. Takahashi & Co., Call Creek, B. C. (File 13095). Katsuji USHIJIMA reported he had left the key with the watchman.

K. Takahashi & Company's interest at Call Creek was sold to John Peden, Victoria, who appears not to have answered our letters, and a letter was sent to "The watchman, K. Takahashi & Co., Call Creek". This was replied to by Mr. M. R. Hadley, who has since been looking after the float house of Ishinosuke ICHIKAWA and the chattels stored in the float house.

Mr. Hadley moved from Call Creek in December, 1942, and moved the float house to another location some seven miles away. At the time he was not able to go to the new location until another watchman was on the job at Call Creek. It was during this time that the float house was broken into, and the lamp and tool chest were stolen.

Minstrel Island, where Mr. Hadley is now located, is at the entrance to Knight Inlet, off Johnstone Strait where Johnstone Strait opens into Queen Charlotte Strait, and it appears to be rather isolated. Alert Bay (not exactly a metropolis itself) appears to be the nearest settlement of any size.

Incidentally, Mr. Hadley's letter of April 6, 1946, was in reply to a letter from Mr. Johnston on Internee File 1081.

Attached are two letters received from Mr. M. R. Hadley, Hadley Shingle Mill, Winstrel Island, B. C. I have been unable to trace the inquiry mentioned in Mr. Hadley's letter of April 6, 1946. It is possible that more than the three files listed above are concerned in the chattels stored at Call Creek. From the three files referred to I have obtained the following information:

File 612, Ishinosuke ICHIKAWA, Reg.No. 10346: Declared 3 beds, 1 kitchen stove, 1 wooden heater, 2 sideboards, stored in a shack on float. No record of sale or shipment.

File 657, Yone (Mrs. Ishinosuke) ICHIKAWA, Reg.No. 10319: Declared, in addition to the 3 beds and stove reported by her husband, 6 chairs, 1 table and kitchen utensils. On May 21, 1943, Mr. Hadley reported that he had shipped four boxes of kitchen utensils to Mrs. ICHIKAWA.

Internee File 1081, Katsaji USHIJIMA, Reg.No. 10317: Declared, 1 complete brass bed, 1 bureau, 1 kitchen stove, 1 camp heater stove, 1 kitchen cabinet, 1 dining table, 3 chairs, 1 small bedside table, 5 boxes chinaware, 1 box kitchen utensils, 1 Aladdin coal oil lamp; 1 gramophone, approx. value \$250.00, stored in company house. He later reported that his chattels were stored in float house belonging to Ishinosuke ICHIKAWA, File 612. The Aladdin lamp was stolen during Mr. Hadley's absence in 1942.

At the time the lamp was stolen a tool chest belonging to an unidentified Mr. TAMANE, Theft reported by Mr. Hadley December 16, 1942.
was also stolen.

According to reports from Mr. Hadley all the goods belonging to Evacuees that he had knowledge of were stored in the float house belonging to ICHIKAWA. This float-house, according to letters received from Mr. Hadley from time to time, was being cared for by Mr. Hadley to the extent that he moved it along with his own equipment as he moved from place to place in his logging operations. Back in 1943, he remarked in a letter "Its care has been quite a problem and I would like very much to be free of it". Which is understandable.

It would seem that something should be done about these chattels and float house to release Mr. Hadley from this burden.

this afternoon as follows:


There are two shareholders of K. Takahashi & Co. Ltd. for one share each, namely, Mrs. Kuni Takahashi and Miss Chitose Uchida. The previous shareholders were Kinji Takahashi and Jutaro Tokunaga. Mr. Kinji Takahashi died at Vancouver, B.C. on March 2nd, 1942 and by his will, which was probated on March 27, 1942, he left all his property, real and personal, to his wife Kuni. His share in the above company was transferred to her pursuant to the will shortly after Letters Probate were issued. The share held by J. Tokunaga, who was the bookkeeper of the company, and had no real beneficial interest in the share, was transferred to Miss Uchida as it is necessary that there be two shareholders in a private company.

Mrs. Takahashi and Miss Uchida are still residing in Vancouver and no part of the money involved in the sale is for the benefit of any person outside British Columbia. Mrs. Takahashi expects to remove shortly from the Coast area and wishes this money to be available to her for living expenses.

I trust I shall have, as arranged, your consent to the disposition of the funds in my hands by the time this letter reaches you.

May I take this opportunity of thanking you for your courtesy in this connection.

The present shareholders are Mrs. Kuni Takahashi of 476 East Cordova Street, whose telephone number is Highland 1846-L and Miss Chitose Uchida also of this City.

An offer has been made by Mr. John Peden of Victoria, B.C. whose solicitors are Messrs. Tait and Marchant of Victoria. Mr. Peden proposes to pay \$10,000.00 cash for the machinery and equipment of the company situate at Call Creek, B.C., and two licenced boats used in connection with the logging business described as 'Loma' and 'Loma II'. The consideration is divided into \$1000.00 for the boats and \$9000.00 for the equipment. Mr. W.F. Clark Jr. representing Mr. Peden has already left for Call Creek to make an inspection of the equipment and if his inspection is satisfactory it is proposed to complete this deal without delay. My instructions are that the equipment and the boats are free from encumbrances but this is being investigated by Mr. F.C. Aubrey, representing Messrs. Tait and Marchant, Mr. Peden's solicitors in Victoria.

It may be that your Department is interested in this matter and I shall be glad if you will make the necessary investigations and let me have your formal consent to this transaction.

If the deal were for cash and consummated before evacuation, the matter would not come under our review at all. If the sale were made under an agreement of sale on a time basis, in view of the fact that Mrs. Takahashi will be evacuated at some future date, we should have a copy of the agreement on our file, and after her evacuation the unfulfilled payments would need to be remitted to this office on her behalf.


