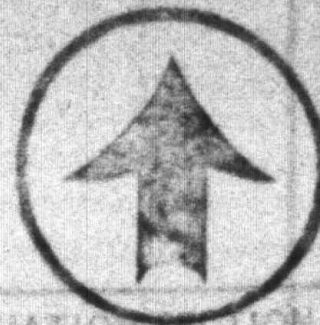

Thank you very much for your letter dated June 18th indicating that the Mode-O-Day Dress Ltd. is indebted to you to the extent of \$2,157.17 for unpaid income taxes for 1941.

In reviewing our file in connection with the Mode-O-Day Dress Ltd. we find that we were advised on January 19, 1942, by Clarence Darling, S.C., 56-57 Commerce Building, 645 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, that his client, Mr. Sidney Liverant, of 650 Granville Street, Vancouver, was purchasing the stock-in-trade and business of Mode-O-Day Dress Ltd., of 413 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, together with the unexpired term of the lease of the premises. Mr. Clarence Darling also indicated that Mr. John Sutherland was solicitor for the vendor.

In reply, Mr. G. W. McPherson, Authorized Deputy of the Secretary of State and/or Custodian, advised Mr. Clarence Darling on January 19, 1942 that the Custodian voiced no objection to the sale mentioned above.

Mr. Kinichi Iwata, Police Registration No. 00915 declared to us on December 7, 1942 that his address was P. O. Box 263 Salmon Arm, B. C. and that his previous occupation was that of a dress manufacturer. Mr. Iwata also indicated that he had left in storage with Messrs. Bowman's Storage Ltd., 827 Powell Street, Vancouver, certain pleating, sponging and pressing machinery together with a buckle machine, 2 button machines and some cases of button and buckle molds, all of which he had insured for a total of \$3,000.00 against loss by fire.

Our records also indicate that on October 2, 1942 Mr. Joe Mizuhara telephoned this office and stated that Mr. Kinichi Iwata had moved certain garment manufacturing equipment to Salmon Arm.
