We have heard from the B. C. Security Commission that the above Japanese has written to them to request shipment of his household effects to him at New Denver. He says you will assume all responsibility for crating the goods and that he will pay all cartage charges to the railway station.

Neither this Japanese nor his wife declared any assets to the Custodian nor have we any liabilities recorded against them. We have therefore no objection to shipment being made and should indeed be much obliged if you would so arrange. If you require any information or assistance, please telephone Mr. Fisher of the B. C. Security Commission, Pacific 7531.

Finally, would you kindly advise this office (not the B. C. Security Commission) whether anything remains in your care after this shipment. Strictly speaking, all Japanese property held for them should have been already declared to this office as per advertisements in the press on December 4th, 1942.

Would you kindly refer to my letter of February 5th on file herewith to Mr. John Hayes (sic)? Mr. Hayes called on me this morning and reported as follows:

(1) Stuff at 508 Alexander St. There is still a good deal of stuff locked up there and perhaps among it are the articles requested.

(2) Stuff at 242 Pender Street. Mr. Hayes knows nothing about this though he saw the Japanese packing some of his things up at 508 Alexander. Some was taken away, he does not know where, and some sold to a Chinese whom he saw handing the Japanese a \$100.00 bill. The Japanese was drunk at the time.

(3) Finally, Mr. Hayes is holding for this Japanese at 519 Powell, the following articles:

- 1 Table
- 1 Dresser
- 1 Looking glass and stand
- Books
- 1 Box misc. articles
- 3 Bed covers

He would like these removed and I promised to do so when we had checked up on everything and decided what to do. He is at home every day until 3:00 p.m.

Would you, therefore, kindly have the above addresses investigated, locate the articles required, advise Mr. Fisher, and see to the safekeeping of whatever is not shipped.

We have received a letter from your New Denver office signed by the Welfare Office and countersigned by the Assistant Supervisor. This letter is in connection with some articles of the above Japanese claimed by him to be missing. Your staff at New Denver have, of course, only heard the Japanese' side of the story and we think that after they have read the following they will agree that no further correspondence on this matter need take place.

This Japanese declared on October 15th that he had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia.

Notwithstanding this, on January 16th he sent a Custodian Release for a long list of articles left with Mr. John Hayes, 519 Powell Street. On reference to this gentleman, we can find only the following items which have now been moved to storage at the Nampa Buddhist Temple.

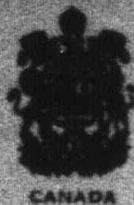

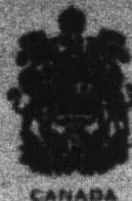
On May 13th, 1943, we shipped eight parcels effects from Vancouver to above, on which we incurred packing, cartage and freight charges of \$13.96. Practically all of these goods were outside the free list, and we expected this person to pay the majority of the costs, at least \$10.00, particularly in view of the fact that this party sent a long telegram asking us to add some other goods to the shipment. Understand this man had some property to be sold. Would it be possible for you to reimburse us to the extent of \$10.00 to apply on these charges if we secured an authorization signed by Mrs. YOSHIKAWA.

Re: Mr. & Mrs. Shigetaro YOSHIKAWA

These files had become very confused and I have spent some time sorting out misfiled correspondence and comparing the transactions that have taken place. The owners appear to be rather muddle-headed to say the least and the position is still not very clear, but fortunately it seems there was never anything of very great value involved. If there was, it was never declared to us before evacuation.

The husband, file 13159, signed a yellow "No Property" card on October 15th but on January 16th, 1943, applied for the shipment of considerable articles left in the care of Mr. Hayes, 519 Powell Street.

The wife, file 13404, did not register until February 1943 by mail from New Denver. She also declared a number of possessions.

Mr. Hayes called on the writer on February 10th and gave him all available information as per memorandum of that date on file 13159. Since then the following has taken place.

(a) Shipment of some items was made on file 13404 in May 1943, partly from 519 Powell St. and partly from 508 Alexander St.

(b) Articles were moved from the care of Mr. Hayes, 519 Powell St. to the Hampa Buddhist Temple as per list #330, February 13th, 1943 on file 13159.

(c) This leaves the following.

(1) Things left at 508 Alexander St. These were inventoried on February 26th, 1943, as per list on file 13159. From this have since been shipped a gramophone and box of groceries as mentioned in (a) above. The present occupier claims
