

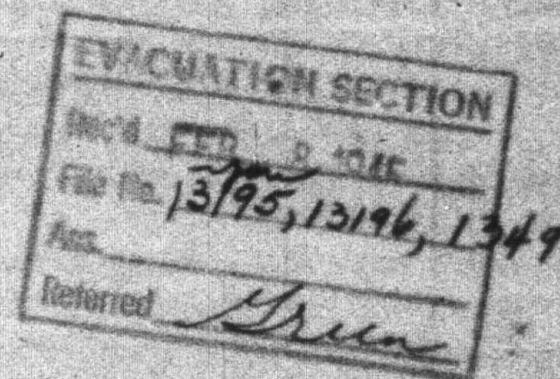

Thank you for your letter dated December 28th.

We have no record of your letter dated December 16th mentioned by you, although we find that we corresponded with you last month in connection with Mr. Munetaka Sameshima who also was associated with the Togo Shoe Repair, Nanaimo.

Mr. Satoshi Maruno has not as yet registered his affairs with the Custodian in spite of requests made to him by mail, but Mr. Maruno's affairs remaining in the Protected Area, nevertheless, vested in the Custodian as from the date of Mr. Maruno's evacuation from the Protected Area.

Please note that the Custodian voices no objection to your effecting shipment to him of certain shoe repairing materials costing approximately \$105.00 and to your charging this amount against balance held to his credit on your ledger of \$110.75.

We observe that you are holding a chattel mortgage on a finisher and stitcher on which a balance is due you by Mr. Maruno of \$513.10, and we assume that you feel that you are amply protected.

Following shipment of the shoe repairing materials you are sending to Lemon Creek, please forward to the Custodian the War Savings Certificates mentioned in your letter together with a cheque, which should be made payable to the Custodian of Enemy Property, for the balance thereafter standing to the credit of Mr. Maruno on your ledger.
