The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on Oct. 16/42 and was evacuated on Oct. 28/42, declared a bedroom suite left in storage with the B. C. Purchasers Co-operative Association, 573 Hastings S., East, Vancouver. This warehouse was ransacked by thieves as per memorandum on file dated August 12/42. We did not find a bedroom suite in the name of Mrs. INOUE.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

The above declared a radio, description not given, left in the care of the Rev. W. H. Gale, 3762 W. 24th Ave., Vancouver. According to letter of Oct. 11/45, from Mr. Gale, this radio was shipped to Mrs. INOUE at Lemon Creek on Sept. 20/45 and receipt of shipment was acknowledged on Sept. 27/45. Permission for this shipment was given by the B.C.S.C.

VICTORY BOND:

The above was the owner of a \$500.00 Dominion of Canada Victory Bond. The sum of \$14.10, representing cashed interest coupons of \$7.50 each on this bond, less insurance and postage charges, was remitted to Mrs. INOUE on Nov. 18/43. The Bond was sent to Mrs. INOUE on Nov. 11/43, through the Royal Bank of Canada.

MEMORANDUM

August 12th, 1943

TO: The File

FROM: Mr. G. B. Spain

Re: B. C. Purchasers Co-operative Association

As the B. C. Security Commission had accumulated sufficient Custodian releases to justify the opening of the premises at 573 East Hastings Street I telephoned Mr. McLennan of Norris & McLennan, the legal representative of the Association, and suggested to them that they should bring the key, and accompany the Custodian officials, and members of the B. C. Security Commission, to arrange identification of chattels.

At 9:00 a.m. today we all met as arranged and Mr. McLennan with the key attempted to open the front door. This proved impossible as there appeared to be some obstruction inside, quite apart from the bad condition of the lock on the door. Eventually we were able to gain entry through the rear door and were then able to understand why the front door could not be forced. Thieves had entered by the front door, and had placed large planks against the door, preventing the opening of it which would insure their uninterrupted examination of all the chattels, most of which appeared to have been packed in boxes. The lids had been torn off the boxes and the contents ransacked and scattered over the floor, and piled up in a state of utter confusion, making shipment impossible. Both Mr. McLennan and the B. C. Security Commission representative realized the fatality of attempting to identify and separate the chattels, so the truck was dismissed.

Mr. McLennan called in detectives who made a cursory examination and left without making comments. This particular location is the hangout corner of the worst element in Vancouver,

All chattels were eventually moved to our warehouse and sold by public auction.

Mr. McLennan sent a representative who in company with our Mr. D. A. Smith spent about one week identifying chattels on the basis of a list supplied by Mr. McLennan. This identification was accomplished only with extreme difficulty.

Under the aforementioned circumstances, the Custodian can assume no responsibility for anything that may be missing.
