We are in receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, enclosing copy of a letter to you, dated April 29, 1946, from your Placement Officer in Montreal, Quebec.

We note that the above named claims there is still the sum of \$275.67 due to him from this office, and we are therefore enclosing herewith a statement of his account with the Custodian as it appears on our books. You will note from our statement that on February 18, 1946, we paid your Department the sum of \$207.00 for medical expenses in connection with his daughter, Miss Seiko Inamoto, whom you advised was under the age of 21 years at the time the indebtedness was incurred. We did not advise Mr. Inamoto that we had paid this account and therefore he was not aware that these funds were deducted from his account.
