CHATELS:

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on Oct. 22/42, and was evacuated on Oct. 23/42, declared a list of goods, mostly equipment used in the making of rice cakes, at 519 Powell St. A report from our agent, H.D. Campbell, indicates the useless nature of the equipment. I made several visits to the premises and on one occasion gained entrance in company with Mr. Nye, who owns the property. I would supplement the report of Mr. Campbell by stating that the articles left by the above at 519 Powell St. have no sales value whatsoever. All the goods which I saw had a home made appearance and were made for the specific purpose of manufacturing rice cakes.

The building at 519 Powell St. is condemned by the authorities, but is being used by Mr. Nye for the storage of old army kitchen pots & pans. It is filled to the ceiling, which prevented me from making a thorough search for the rice grinder, but as rice grinders were a drug on the market at our auction sales, I do not think that when it is uncovered it will have any sale value. We advised the above of our opinion in this matter.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

The above delivered a Sparton radio to the R.C.M.P. on March 9/42, and they handed this radio over to the Custodian on Jan. 27/44. It was sold at auction for the net sum of \$47.76; and this amount was credited to his account.

We have been advised by G.H. Cottrell & Co. that they are holding nine pieces of effects in storage for the above and that the sum of \$14.30 is owing for storage charges. That was in February, 1945. We advised Mr. HAYASHI of this at that time.

No property interests other than those mentioned are found on the file.

The above noted rice cake maker declared what appears to be quite an impressive collection of chattels at 519 Powell St.

The cake dryers, three in number, are still there, being square tin boxes. These are rusted and have no sale value.

The brick stove or oven is attached to the building and has no value, in fact it represents a liability to the purchaser of the building who will have to have it demolished.

The wooden trays, baskets and tins listed had no value and were discarded.


1. The property of the above evacuee declared in the "JP" Declaration, consisted entirely of a few chattels and equipment of a Rice Cake Maker.

2. The above premises, previously occupied by Hayashi, are now rented by P. C. Gibbens & Co. to a Mr. H. Levson.

3. The main items listed are - 2 brick ovens which are built into the property and remain where they were. The 2 dryers with trays are also still located on the premises. The flour grinding machine, which weighs several hundred pounds, is still situated on the premises and a very obsolete type - I doubt if it has any value except for scrap metal and I personally consider it would be advisable to sell it for scrap.

The stone grinder was not on the premises at my original inspection and is naturally not there now. The 17 wooden trays, roaster and baskets have no value and are simply cluttering up the premises. The cans also have no value and it probably could be arranged for them to be taken away by a party purchasing the flour grinding machine for scrap, if this was done.

4. There is none of the chattels which I consider worth storing and my recommendation is that the grinding machine should be disposed of as scrap and the odds and ends got rid of at the same time, which would enable you to close your file on this case.

We must reserve the right to make a search when the congestion is removed.

Unless you discover it in the meantime, we would request you to kindly inform us when a proper search may be made for the missing machine.

Your file has been reviewed and the following has been noted.

When you made your declaration to the Custodian on October 22nd, 1944, you declared a list of goods, mostly equipment used in making rice cakes. Our representative, appointed to handle these articles, reported that they had little, if any, sale value. A second inspection confirmed this report. It would appear that these articles had been used for a considerable time, were worn out, or had become obsolete, and of no use to anyone except persons interested in making rice cakes. We could find no buyer for these goods and they were allowed to remain on the premises.

You delivered a Spartan radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on March 9th, 1942, and they handed this radio over to the Custodian on January 27th, 1944. It was sold at auction for the net sum of \$47.76, and this amount was credited to your account.

A claim was filed against you by the City of Vancouver, Scavenging Department, for scavenging services during the months of August and September, at 519 Powell Street, in the sum of ninety cents. We have paid this account out of your account, leaving your balance standing at \$46.86, and we now enclose Custodian cheque in your favour in this amount.

We have been advised by Messrs. G. H. Cottrell & Company that they are holding in storage under your name nine pieces of effects. We advised you of this in our letter of February 26th, 1945, and also stated that the sum of \$14.30, representing storage charges on these effects, was overdue on that date. We have not been advised by you as to what action was taken with regard to these effects.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
