PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Kinzo FUJIOKA, Reg. No. 12229
Deceased

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on October 21, 1942. He died at New Denver, B. C. on April 3, 1944.

In his declaration he reported equipment for fish cake store, which he stated had probably been reported by his mother. His mother, on September 1, 1942, reported that she owned no property, and it is assumed that the equipment was disposed of in some manner by the mother prior to that date.

A small radio belonging to this man was surrendered to the RCMP. This radio was released to the B. C. Security Commission on December, 1943, for shipment to the owner.

On June 16, 1944, "Y. Fujioka", apparently the mother of the deceased, requested shipment of personal effects stored 385 Cordova St. East. The registration number given in the release is that of the deceased, and it is possible that the effects may have been his. On February 16, 1945, Mr. Fisher of the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, informed this office that he would arrange for shipment of these goods. It is assumed that shipment was made.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Kinzo FUJIOKA, who died at New Denver, B. C. on April 3, 1944, declared on his "JP" form that he owned "equipment of fish-cake store, details unknown, probably registered by mother". Mrs. Iayo FUJIOKA (File No. 11932), mother of the deceased, signed a "No Property" card on which she stated that the store was closed and it may, therefore, be assumed that the equipment mentioned had been disposed of prior to evacuation.

Kinzo FUJIOKA also owned a small radio with one set of earphones which was removed from his bedside table in the St. Joseph's Oriental Hospital by the R. C. M. P. This item was of very little value and was shipped to the owner on December 16, 1943.

The file reveals claims against the deceased as follows:

Mr. Kinzo Fujioka died at the New Denver Sanatorium sometime in the early part of this year according to a report received from his creditor, Sakugoro Fukuyama, as per copy of the latter's letter of May 6th on the deceased's file.

He declared "equipment of fish-cake store, details unknown, probably registered by mother." In addition, a small radio and one set of earphones was removed by the R.C.M.P., perhaps rather unnecessarily, from his bedside table.

Reference to his mother's file shows merely a yellow "No Property" card and none of the other children reveal on their files any evidence of the fish-cake store equipment referred to. It may, therefore, be assumed that this was disposed of before evacuation and that the only asset belonging to the deceased is the radio equipment referred to above. In view of the small value involved, this may be liquidated in line with our general policy.
