GENERAL SUMMARY

Isamu INOUE died at the San-Jubilee Hospital at Victoria, B. C. on August 29, 1942. He is survived by his father, Masakichi INOUE (file 2141) and his mother, Ei INOUE (file 10790).

The only assets of the deceased, revealed on this file, were a few clothes and a Life Insurance Policy in the amount of \$1,000.00. The clothes were shipped to the parents of the deceased by the B. C. Security Commission. A claim was filed with the Insurance Company by the B. C. Security Commission for \$613.71. This claim was made up the sum of \$484.30, which was the portion of the charge of \$1,350.00 made by the Provincial Board of Health (T.B. Unit) for hospitalization for which the B. C. Security Commission was responsible, namely 167 days (from March 15, 1942 to August 29, 1942), at the rate of \$2.90 per day (the special rate given to B. C. Security Commission), plus the cost of the funeral of the deceased and transportation costs for the parents attending the funeral. The balance of the insurance, \$305.08, was forwarded to the beneficiary, Ei INOUE, by the Insurance Company. The file does not reveal by what authority this deduction was made.

The balance owing to the Provincial Board of Health, \$849.00, is the charge for the period, June 5, 1941 to March 15, 1942, prior to the B. C. Security Commission assuming responsibility, 283 days at the regular charge of \$3.00 per day. This claim is still outstanding against the Estate of the deceased and also against his father, Masakichi INOUE, as the deceased was not of age at the time the indebtedness was incurred.

We confirm our telephone conversation of this afternoon on the subject of the above youth, who died August 29th, 1942, at the Royal Jubilee Hospital, Tuberculosis Division, Victoria.

The only liability carried in his file is the unpaid balance (\$849.00) of Provincial Board of Health account for \$1,350.00. There being no funds in this account, nor other assets, this file was closed, your claim being transferred to and carried in the file of his father, Masakichi INOUE, Reg. 08600 (File 2141).

It is now desired to close the latter file also, in which there are no realizable assets nor funds with which to meet the claims recorded therein, and we note that under these circumstances your claim will be written off.
