I wish to acknowledge your letter of April 12th containing some further information about the name of the assured under the above numbered policy and also enclosing a new wording for the policy and your explanation about the removal permit which had been issued in error. I am sorry to say that we are still unable to relate this policy to the proper file in this office.

Josuke INOUE, File No. 5457, Registration No. 09328, is a man who reported his age to be 66 years. His home address was shown as Mayo Lumber Company at Paldi, B. C. This man was retired apparently and lived with his son.

The son's name was Tomojiro INOUE, File No. 5202, Registration No. 09150. He was a man 42 years of age and his address was given as the Mayo Lumber Company, Paldi, B. C., but I believe he owned a dwelling in Duncan, the legal description of which was shown as Lot 12, Block 18, Plan 2070, Qualicum District.

It would be of material assistance in finding out what person this insurance should be charged to if you could let us know where the furniture and other personal effects covered under this policy had been prior to being moved to storage at the location shown on the above numbered policy.

Incidentally the bill that originally came to this office covering the premium on this policy showed the name as being H. INOUE and gave the Registration No. as 09150 which, as you will see by

In reply to your letter of the 7th inst., we find that the name shown on the goods that were insured under this policy is "Jackie N. Inouye". We would suggest that this is the English nickname for "Josuke" which is a habit, we believe, many Japanese adopt.

As to the second paragraph, we regret that when the policy was prepared in the Company Office there was a mix up in the map references and the goods were insured primarily at the wrong location. We pointed this out to them and asked for a new wording to be attached to the policy. Unfortunately a removal permit was issued instead which is the cause of your present query.

We have now had them issue a new wording and we would suggest that you remove the present original wording and removal permit and attach the new wording in its place.

We regret that this oversight occurred.

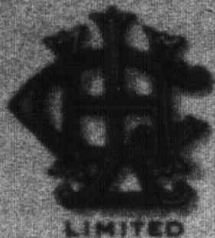
