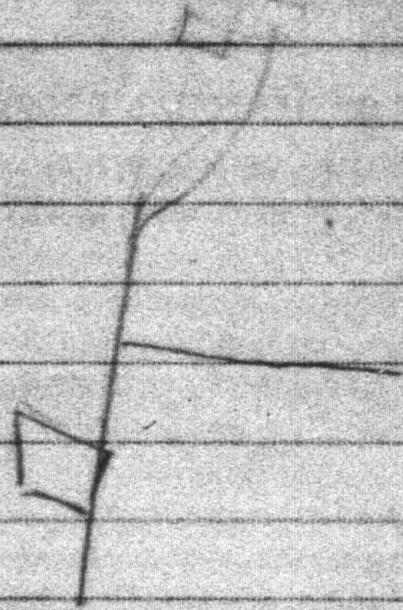

MEMORANDUM

17th November, 1945.

Re: Chattels declared by Kyuga GDA

The chattels declared by the above Japanese and which were inventoried on his file, were also inventoried and liquidated on the file of his wife, File #13394, and they are well accounted for with the exception of a few items which were stolen in January, 1943, and shown as having been stolen on a report from our representative.

Net proceeds derived from the sale of all chattels on the wife's file total \$177.48, which together with those sold on Kyuga's file netting \$2.74, total \$180.22, plus \$9.00 for the horse.

The above facts completely change the aspect of the chattel picture on the file of the above Japanese.

Dear Madam

Your file has come under review and we take this opportunity of giving you a brief summary of our administration of your affairs.

You did not register with the Custodian at the time of your evacuation from the Protected Area, but on the 19th April, 1943, your declaration form was forwarded to this office through the B.C. Security Commission, and attached to your declaration was an itemized list of chattels and personal belongings, set out as being owned by you and still on your husband's property at Mission. Our field men took a complete inventory of all chattels on your husband's property and according to their inventory the articles declared by you are very well accounted for. It is noted on this inventory, household effects and farm tools were listed, which we now find were also declared by your husband.

In accordance with the Canadian Government's policy of liquidation all saleable chattels were sold at Public Auction, and we have attached hereto a complete itemized schedule of the net results from the sale, showing net proceeds derived were \$177.48. This sum was credited to your account. We had previously written to your husband advising him that the chattels had been stolen, but we are writing to him today explaining their liquidation under your account.

Your husband informed us of a bank account in your name at Mission. This, however, was not brought under control by the Custodian.

Attached hereto is a Custodian cheque in the amount of \$177.48 representing your full credit balance at this office, and it would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian. In order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
