GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 13423

Matsu SHONO, Deceased

Reg. No. 14546

Matsu SHONO died at the Escondale Mental Hospital on December 21, 1942. She is survived by her husband, Konosuke, file #3417; two sons, Giichi, file #2966, and Koichi, file G/191; and two daughters, Kiyoka, file #3462 and Sumiye, a minor, all resident in Alberta.

The deceased made no declaration to the Custodian and nothing is known of her assets, other than the fact that she was insured in the Pacific Union Mutual Aif Fund under Certificate of Membership #68 and the amount of \$105.00 was collected for the beneficiary under the policy, Konosuke SHONO, husband of the deceased, by this office and credited to his account.

The Collector of Institutional Revenue filed a claim against the deceased and her husband for the sum of \$511.65, being hospital bill for 379 days at \$1.35 per day in the Provincial Mental Hospital. Through negotiation by this office, the Collector of Institutional Revenue agreed to accept the sum of \$255.83, being 50% of the account, as full settlement. This amount was paid, with the approval of Konosuke SHONO, from his account. The B. C. Security Commission filed a claim for funeral expenses in the sum of \$80.00. This was also paid by Konosuke SHONO from his account in this office.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

We wish to thank you for your reply dated April 22nd in which you advise us that Mr. K. SHONO was beneficiary under the above mentioned Membership No. 68.

We are endeavouring to decide as to whether proceeds amounting to \$105.00 in connection with the death claim under the above certificate should be treated as part of the deceased's estate or whether it should be considered as belonging to the beneficiary in the same category as would the proceeds in settlement of a death claim under ordinary life insurance.

I have in front of me the Certificate No. 68 which had been issued to Mrs. M. SHONO and I see that the member is entitled to all of the benefits contained in the By-Laws of the Society and it refers specifically to By-Law 9. Would you be good enough, please, to let us have a copy of the By-Laws referred to therein.

We would be interested to know what your usual practice has been in the past in connection with the payment of death benefits. Has it been your practice to pay funeral expenses direct, or has it been done by making a cheque payable to the beneficiary.

There is another question I would like to clear up too. Mr. K. SHONO, husband of your deceased member, also holds a certificate of membership in the Pacific Union Mutual Aid Fund, and at the time you paid the claim under Membership No. 68, there were dues

amounting to \$1.00 for 1943 outstanding on his certificate. As I read the 2nd paragraph of the application for membership, signed by Mrs. R. SHONO, on the 17th day of February, 1939, you were authorized and directed to deduct that money from funds owing by you under Certificate No. 68. I know that he definitely is interested in maintaining his membership in good standing with your Association.
