



Please find attached hereto inthorisation for removal of the Church Shrine and accessories dated July 9, 1949, which is signed by Reverend I. Kawamura, K. Oike and T. Okabe. The actual Receipt for the Shrine and accessories dated June 10, 1949, signed by Mr. Okabe and Mr. Oike only is also attached to this memorandum.

Reverend I. Kawamura left the Temple and Haney rather unexpectedly, as far as I was concerned, on July 9th, 1949, and I did not, therefore, obtain all the necessary information regarding disposition of the furniture and other items belonging to the Church. Mr. Kawamura did not identify the Church goods, nor did he indicate with goods were to be shipped, sold or destroyed. He did say, however, that the good organ (one is valueless) should be shipped to "The Buddhist Church, 330 Edmonton Street, Winnipeg, Mamitoba".

Mr. Okabe and Mr. Olke were uncertain regarding the wishes of the Church officials in connection with the furniture as they only had instructions relating to the Shrine. They did assure me, however, that they would interview Mr. Kawamura, and the Church officers and trustees, on their return trip to Wimnipeg, with a view to holding a meeting for the purpose of authorizing representatives to deal with affairs relating to final disposition of the Real and Personal properties of the Church at Haney. They promised to forward a copy of the Minutes of the Meeting to our office.

In the meantime, however, we might write for instructions regarding the furniture and any other articles remaining in the building belonging to the Church, but before such letter is written it will be necessary to check our inventory covering Church goods in order to send a definite list of Hems on hand, together with particulars of their present condition.

Mr. Anderson that the Japanese had gone to the Tample the provious aftermoon, sometime after three evaluate, Mr. Johnston then proceeded to the
building with Mr. Anderson and found the Chabes, both father and son, Mr.
Oike, the Reverend Kasamure, and D. Chabe from Hatsis (no relation to the
other Chabes) already inside the building. Standing outside were a trust
operated by Chabe from Hatsis and an automobile operated by Chabe and Cine.
Mr. Anderson explained that the look on the door had been broken by the
Japanese in order to enter.

Mr. Johnston reports that Okabe and Oile stated to him that they had entered the building on the afternoon of Wednesday, June 5th, that they started moving things around and taking the Shrine spart, and that Oile had remained in the building overnight. By the time Mr. Johnston arrived the Shrine was nearly dismuntled and some packing had been done.

We Contedian representative was present when the Japanese entered the building mor until the following morning, June 9th, when Mr. Johnston arrived. Mr. Johnston stated that since he was alone there were times when so Contedian representative was present and that on one consider when he returned from Juneb, on June 9th, he saw several bones on the truck which he was informed by the Japanese had been removed from the building in his absence and which he named to be returned to the building, after which Okabe drove the truck away, accompanied by Mr. Kavenure.

be legiced the building, refusing to allow Oike to remain overnight. He reburned at 8,30 the following morning, Friday, June 10th, and opened the building. The Japanese continued packing the Shrine and disposing of the church goods, which were taken by nowing van to the C. P. R. station. The building was again looked at 7,30 p.m. On Saturday morning, June 11th, Mr. Johnston seturned to the building again and further goods were removed to the C. P. R. freight shed, the Temple being finally alosed shortly before 12 non with a new padlock.

During the three days of Mr. Johnston's attendance in the building Olks found and identified his own shrine and framed pictures, which he shipped, with Mr. Johnston's consent, with the church shrine to Vinnipeg and gave his release for same. The Okabes, father and son, located and identified their

shrine (Duddeson), all their dishes, and one lot of wooden books which they removed with Mr. Johnston's consent and shipped with the shurch shrine to Manipeg and gave a release for some. Knowners found and identified goods belonging to bimself and others, which were not removed from the building at that time as Mr. Johnston wished to investigate whether slains had on made for such goods.
