Dear Sir:

We are in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant and note contents.

In reply, we wish to advise you that it will not be necessary, in this case, to take out Letters of Administration as the only asset of the deceased, according to our records, is a credit balance of \$50.00 with the Custodian. These funds were received from the Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir) Limited and represent the salvage value of House No. 10, No. 1 Japanese Town, Cumberland, occupied by the late Mr. Yoshikuni. This house was situated on land owned by the above Company to whom no ground rent had been paid for some years. We were informed that the right of occupation and use of any structure on the land was to terminate if the occupant ceased to be an employee of the Company. The above amount, however, was paid by the Company in settlement of the matter after our Agent had appraised the house formerly occupied by the deceased.

The late Mr. Yoshikuni declared to the Custodian on April 23, 1943, that he had \$250.00 in the Royal Bank, Cumberland, B. C., but we have been advised by said Bank that this account was closed on July 27, 1943.

The Department of Labour, Japanese Division, have filed a claim for \$80.00 in connection with funeral expenses and we will be forwarding funds on hand on this account, unless said Department decides to waive sufficient funds to liquidate the claim of the Cumberland & Union Pottery Co. Ltd., in the sum of \$17.99.

Re: Katie Blanche Jamieson SAITA

Reference is made to the claim of the Prudential Insurance Company of America against the individual mentioned above concerning which you wrote to us on April 24th. Acknowledgment of receipt of your claim was sent to you on April 25th.

We have delayed communicating with you in this connection in anticipation of our obtaining the registration of Dr. Harold Sakae SAITA. We are today finally informed that Dr. Saita is probably going to remain in Vancouver for some time to come, and in any case he has not as yet registered his assets with the Custodian.

It appears to us as highly unlikely that Mrs. Katie Saita is in any way effected by the regulations which called for the removal of the individuals of the Japanese race.

We make the suggestion, therefore, that you advise your clients that in so far as the Custodian's Office is concerned the Custodian has no objection to your clients taking any legal steps themselves, should the need for such steps arise, to protect their interests in so far as Mrs. Saita is concerned.
