GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 13552

Deceased

This man died at the Vancouver General Hospital on October 25, 1946.

The file reveals no real property or chattels belonging to the deceased.

The file of Naka NAGATSUKA, Enemy File 398, widow of the deceased, reveals that the sum of \$893.99 was received from the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada on July 13, 1943. This was in payment of the death claim under Policy #2,215,922 on the life of Tora NAGATSUKA, which was payable to Naka NAGATSUKA, as beneficiary. Naka NAGATSUKA is believed to be a resident of Japan.

The New York Life Insurance Company paid to the Custodian, at Ottawa, a sum of money due under Policy #6945021, a 20-year Endowment Policy which matured on April 1, 1941. The only indication of the amount of money paid to the Custodian at Ottawa is contained in letter of November 17, 1942, from the Collector of Institutional Revenue for the Province of British Columbia, which states, "The deceased had a \$5.00 credit surrender value on Policy No. 6945021 in the New York Life." This letter is on Enemy File 398. It is not known whether this money was payable to the Estate of the deceased or to a beneficiary.

The two policies are the only known assets of the deceased or his widow.

The Collector of Institutional Revenue has filed claim for \$1,635.00, representing hospitalization charges against Tora NAGATSUKA - 545 days at \$3.00 a day. This claim is carried on this file as well as on Enemy File 398.

This file does not reveal by whom the funeral expenses were paid.

This file reveals no other liabilities.

Attached please find one copy of a claim for \$1,635.00 dated November 17th made by the Provincial Board of Health, together with a copy of a letter of the same date from the Collector of Institutional Revenue and copy of a letter dated November 20th from the Sun Life Assurance Company.

Mr. Nagatsuka died on October 25th, 1941. The beneficiary, Naka Nagatsuka, is in Japan. The Sun Life are holding approximately \$900.00 payable to the beneficiary in Japan. The New York Life have a credit of approximately \$5.00.

You will probably desire to effect collection in both instances and thereafter take up the matter of meeting, at least in part, the claim of the Collector of Institutional Revenue. In this connection you may perhaps wish to refer to your File No. 398.

Your letter of the 19th instant was duly received and our records indicate that under policy No. 2,215,922 the assured is described as Tora Nagatsuka whereas in your letter you refer to him as Mr. Ko. Nagatsuka.

This policy became a claim on October 5th, 1941. The sum assured is \$1,000, from which it is our intention to deduct the automatic premium loan which amounts to \$110.33. The beneficiary named under this contract was the assured's wife, Naka Nagatsuka, and from the information we have on file she is at the present time residing in Japan. No payment whatsoever has been made to the beneficiary under this policy and we presume that for the time being settlement will have to remain in abeyance.

In reply to your letter of November 11th, the
above-named Patient was admitted to the Provincial Tuberculosis Unit
on December 5/38 and discharged on May 1/39, re-admitted on Septem-
ber 22/39 and died in the Unit on October 25/41, making a total of
545 days at \$3.00 per day - \$1,635.00.

From 1934 to 1938 he worked for the Japanese Asso-
ciated Cleaners, 1638 W. 3rd Ave., Vancouver. In 1933 he worked for
the Guarantee Cleaners at 1110 Union St. The deceased had no known
relatives in Canada and lived in rooming house at 391 Powell Street.
He was insured with the Sun Life, Policy #2215922 and the beneficiary
under that Policy was his wife who resides in Japan. The Insurance
Company informed me that they were holding the funds until the foreign
exchange regulations change. The deceased also had a \$5.00 credit
surrender value on Policy #6945021 in the New York Life. The approx-
imate age at date of death would be 47. On his admittance to the
hospital he gave us the name of a friend to notify in case of death,
Gengo Nishimura, 395 Powell St., Vancouver.

I enclose account in duplicate in the amount of
\$1,635.00 and trust this information is sufficient to satisfy our
claim.
