Remarks: This is a small holding with little land development, and equipped as a poultry proposition. The poultry houses are in fair condition but have never been first class structures. The dwelling is a very poor type of building and poorly constructed. The property lies on a rise of land which runs north and south through this area with a stone and gravel ridge protruding at the height of land which takes in most of this holding. The water situation is very poor here, and wells are said to go dry for a month or six weeks during the summer.

The property is rented to D. Hubbard for \$10 a month, plus taxes, to the end of the current year.

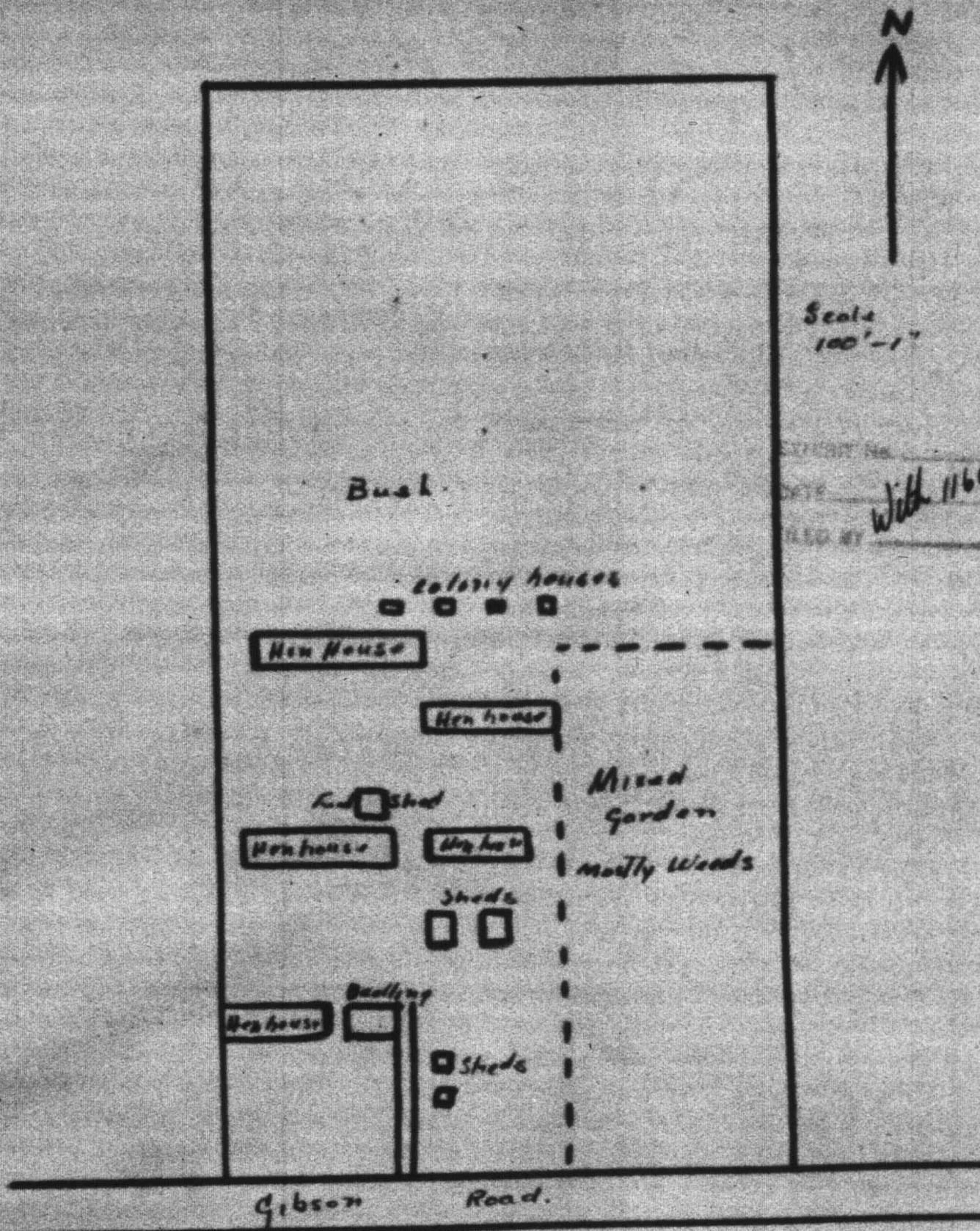

In her JP Mrs. Goto declared the real property later found to belong to her husband.

Mrs. Goto, also, declared farming tools and implements and household furniture left at the farm at Strawberry Hill, Surrey, B.C.

File 13566 - Yasukichi GOTO #12603 - Evacuated March 13, 1942
Committed to Provincial Mental Hospital April 28/42.
JP, dated December 19, 1942, signed by one of his daughters (according to evidence at hearing).

JP reports real property registered in name of Yasukichi Goto, and also farm equipment. The real property is dealt with in the Real Property Summary. Rentals and proceeds of sale of real property have been credited to the account of Yasukichi Goto.

The proceeds of the sale of farm equipment and household effects were credited to the account of Mrs. Goto, and all funds from her account were remitted to Mrs. Goto July 17, 1947. Statement of account June 25, 1947, shows that Mrs. Goto received \$100.59, made up of \$96.09 net proceeds of sale of farm and household goods, and \$4.50 rent of a brooder.

Breakdown of the sales shows that Mrs. Goto's account in the \$96.09 credit received proceeds of sales of farm and household goods as follows: prices shown are gross

(We did sell 3 brooder stoves, which may have been the only saleable part of the incubators)

Electric Water Pump was sold as a fixture with real property.

Jan. 11/43 Mrs. Goto wrote stating she had no legal interest in her husband's property, except that before he had left for the road camp he had made a will leaving everything to Mrs. Goto and the children.

CLASSIFICATION: This is a small fruit farm with dwelling and out-buildings. The Custodian's representative reported July 7th, 1942, that this property had an area of 4.75 acres (mostly cleared) and planted to the following crops: 1 acre strawberries and black currants (Mixed). 1/8 acre raspberries and gooseberries (Mixed). 1 dozen mixed fruit trees.
1 - 1½ storey 7-room dwelling 30'x36'. 1 storage shed. 1 straw shed. 1 woodshed. 1 feed house (new 2 rooms) 18'x18'. 1 chicken house 120'. 1 chicken house 72'. 1 chicken house 100'. 2 chicken houses 60'. 3 colony houses.
"Everything becoming grown over, most buildings becoming poor for lack of care. Upstairs of house unfinished".

HISTORY OF ADMINISTRATION: Miyoshi GOTO, file 7706 (Wife of Yasukichi GOTO), leased this property to Donald Palmer Hubbard, 8th June 1942, for a term of 1 year from June 8th, 1942. Consideration \$120.00 - \$50.00 paid in advance 8th June 1942, and balance of \$70.00 payable at rate of \$10.00 monthly from November 8th, 1942. This lease was replaced by Lease No. 522 given by the Custodian to Donald P. Hubbard on May 13th, 1943, for a term of 1 year and 207 days from June 8th, 1943, to December 31st, 1944. Consideration \$188.00 payable \$10.00 monthly for 18 months commencing July 8th, 1943, and final payment of \$8.00 on December 8th, 1944, in addition \$2.50 per month for taxes for years 1942, 1943 & 1944.

Original lease handed to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act, August 18th, 1943, and Lease No. 522 was handed to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act, 29th July 1943.

SOLD: To The Director, The Veterans' Land Act for \$587.00 as at 1st January 1943.
Approval of Advisory Committee - 1st June 1943.

Funds released to the credit of Yasukichi GOTO as at April 17th, 1944, against which were the following charges: Registration Fees \$3.00,

Legal Fees \$15.00, Arrears of Taxes \$18.88 = \$36.88, leaving a net credit of \$550.12 from said transaction.

In view of the rents having been collected by the Custodian up to August 8th, 1943, viz., \$75.00, the following cheques covering same were issued by the Custodian: Cheque to Donald P. Hubbard, June 8th, 1943, \$26.75 being payment in full of repairs to roof of GOTO'S house, and cheque covering the balance of the rents collected, viz., \$48.25, was issued to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act, 17th November 1943.


The B.C. Security Commission remitted to this office, the sum of \$1.72, on the 20th October, 1942, being for March and April wages.





We wish to inform you that the above-named Japanese national (born March 27, 1898) is reported to have been confined in the Essondale Mental Hospital on April 28, 1942, while under the control of the B. C. Security Commission.

Proceeds from sale of property belonging to Yasukichi Goto which vested in the Custodian at the time of the Evacuation amount to \$570.84. We understand that the circumstances require that this money be turned over to the Attorney General for administration and we are therefore enclosing Custodian cheque No. 7519 for \$570.84, together with a statement showing how this sum is made up.

This office has no knowledge of debts owing by this man nor is aware of other assets, with the possible exception of Sun Life Assurance Policy No. 2205567 which did not come under the control of the Custodian and concerning which no action has been taken.

Royal Canadian Mounted Police Records obtained at the time of the Evacuation give this man's family as follows:
