

The bed shipped to above on March 15th from 573
East Hastings was not received, and on taking same up with
the Canadian Pacific Railway loss was acknowledged. Claim
was placed and settlement has now been received from the
C.P.R. of \$6.80. This amount covers the \$1.80 freight charges
paid by us and \$5.00 as the value of the bed, the goods having
been released at 10s a pound and the weight of the bed being
50 lbs. We paid the Richmond Transfer \$1.25 cartage, the major
portion of which was due to searching among other goods at the
above point. This leaves \$3.75 credit, which I am instructing
the Treasury to pay HAMADE direct unless advised to the contrary
by the Custodian. The file shows that this man has considerable
indebtedness with the Custodian.



We have now heard from our Lemon Greek Supervisor regarding the claims lodged against the above named man. Our Supervisor writes as follows:-

" We interviewed this man on October 28th and he admits that the Vancouver General Mospital account, no doubt, is correct, but that he is unable to make any payment against this account, giving as his reasons that he has a wife and five children to susport . (2) As to the B. C. Purchasers Co-Operative Association, in the amount of \$29.45, Mr Hamade states that he does not know what this account is for and aske that an itemized account be submitted in order that he may know what he is being charged for "X" Hamade refuses to authorize the Custodian to use the balance of his funds held by them to be credited against the Vencouver General Pospital account." "This man and his son are working at the Burns Lumber Co., at Passmore where their average wase would be \$5:00 per day. From this it will be easily seen that the family have a vary good monthly revenue and should be able, if they were willing, to rake some payment against their outstanding indebtedness. However, this is a case similar to a great many more where the femily can make some payment but evidently they have made up their minds not to do so, and we believe that the only way in which an account of this nature can be collected would be by garmishee of the man's wages."
