On March 2/43 he advised us through the B.C. Security Commission that all his property was declared to the Custodian in the name of his wife, Moto SUZUKI, File 6438. This file will be reviewed and reported on in due course.

On March 13/43 he signed a "No property card" stating that he had no property of any kind whatsoever in the protected area in British Columbia.

The file reveals that the above owned no specified articles.

On December 20th, 1945, you requested, through the Department of Labour, that the total amount of your credit balance be forwarded to you, and in accordance with this request, we now enclose our cheque in the sum of \$18.99.

On March 2nd, 1943, you advised us through the British Columbia Security Commission that all your property was declared to the Custodian in the name of your wife, Moto. Her file will be reviewed separately and reported on in due course. On March 13th, 1943, you signed a "No property card" stating that you had no property of any kind whatsoever in the protected area in British Columbia.

On September 25th, 1942, two cheques, made in your favour, were received in this office, both being for wages owing to you. One from the Receiver General of Canada in the sum of \$7.43 and the other from the Department of Mines in the sum of \$11.56. Both of these amounts were credited to your account giving you a total credit balance of \$18.99.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
