


Dear Mr. McPherson:-

Will you please advise me if the affairs of this man have been settled by you and whether Canadian Celanese Limited can now forward him his dividends direct.

Regarding your letter of July 2nd, the staff advise me that they have endeavored to locate these parties but have been unable to obtain any information concerning them. In any event, the Order-in-Council permits them to take their securities with them and I have assumed that dividends follow the securities and this office has not endeavored to collect same. It would, therefore, appear that the Canadian Celanese Limited can now forward the dividends direct, if they can locate the individuals.

MEMORANDUM

To Mr. Alexander

December 23rd, 1942.

From Mr. Ian Macpherson

Sumi NISHIKAWA made declaration to the Custodian on the 25th of August, 1942, of a parcel of land being the East half of Lot 5, Block 290, D.L.526, Group 1, District of New Westminster, Plan No.590, stating that her husband was the owner thereof. On September 1st, 1942, she and her husband, Sahel Nishikawa, transferred the property for a nominal consideration, to Amelia Skulinowski and Deed was registered on Sept. 5th. The purchase price is said to have been \$1550, plus taxes and insurance amounting to \$30.30, a total of \$1580.30. The purchaser assumed a balance of \$800 of principal of a mortgage and \$12 accrued interest, amounting to a total of \$812.00, and paid the balance of \$768.30 to the vendors. This payment has been confirmed by Mr. Skulinowski and by Mr. Durant of Yarwood and Durant, Solicitors, Vancouver. The conveyance was signed by Sahel Nishikawa and Sumi Nishikawa as joint tenants. The property is assessed for land and building at \$975.00.

It is to be noted that the date of transfer was subsequent to the declaration of Mrs. Nishikawa.

Will you kindly advise if any further action by this Department is required.
