

As set forth in Regulation 24 of the Defence of Canada Regulations
(Consolidation).

I, **KONDO, Kiechi**....., at present of **Angler Internment Camp,**
in the Province of **Ontario**....., in the Dominion of Canada,
do hereby declare that I am a **Canadian Born**..... ~~subject~~
citizen.

I now, in consideration of my release or exemption from
detention as a ~~subject~~ citizen of **Canada**....., hereby under-

take and promise that I will report to such officer or official
and upon such terms as the Canadian authorities may from time
to time prescribe; that I will carefully observe and obey the
laws of Canada and such rules or regulations as may specially
be prescribed for my conduct by competent authority; that I
will strictly abstain from taking up arms against and from doing
any act of hostility towards the Government of this country, and
that, except with the permission of the officer or official under
whose surveillance I may be placed, I will strictly abstain from
communicating to anyone whomsoever any information concerning the
existing war or the movement of troops or the military prepara-
tions which the authorities of Canada, or the United Kingdom or
any of his Majesty's dominions or any allied or associated Power
may make, or concerning the resources of Canada, and that I will
do no act and will not encourage the doing of any act which might
be of injury to the Dominion of Canada or the United Kingdom or
any of his Majesty's dominions or any allied or associated Power.

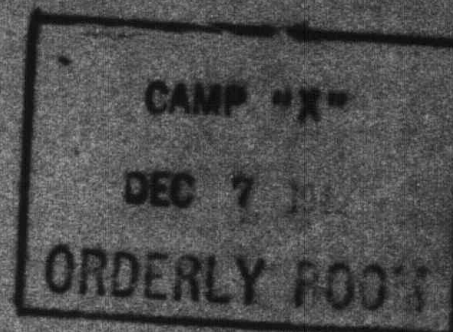

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 13717

RE: Kiechi KONDO, Reg. No. 12142

This file reveals that KONDO owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mr. KONDO was interned on June 29/42 and released on Nov. 27/42.

He declared 2 boxes of kitchenware left at 376 - 4th Ave., Vancouver. Mr. Spain in his memo of Dec. 11/44 states that when he went to this address the lady, Mrs. Humphries advised him that Mr. and Mrs. KONDO prior to their evacuation, had moved their chattels to Mr. J.G. NAKASHIMA's place at 344 W. 4th Ave. On checking the file of NAKASHIMA, 10807, I find that a Mr. Kotohei ISHIHARA, File 1566, had been the tenant of this place. All the chattels were removed from this address to Willard's Auction room, with the exception of some boxes which appeared to contain personal goods only. These were moved to 992 Powell St.

The chattels moved to Willard's were sold at auction for the net sum of \$64.37 and this sum was credited to the account of ISHIHARA. The chattels removed to 992 Powell St. in his name were sold for the sum of \$9.47 and this sum credited to his account. However these moneys have not been remitted to ISHIHARA as it is believed that the chattels of NAKASHIMA are also included in these sales. There is no memo on either the file of NAKASHIMA or ISHIHARA that KONDO also had goods there. A letter has been sent to NAKASHIMA and ISHIHARA, together with a list of goods sold at these auctions, and requesting that they decide between them which goods belong to each of them. No reply has been received from either of them. I am therefore writing to KONDO and also to NAKASHIMA and ISHIHARA advising them that the 2 boxes of kitchen utensils KONDO left at this address must also be included in these auction sales and that it will be necessary for the three of them to decide the ownership of the goods sold.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: Mr. KONDO also declared the radio and record player declared by his wife. These were sold at auction and the proceeds credited to her account.

MONEYS RECEIVABLE: KONDO declared a refund of income tax deductions was due him for 1941 and that the sum amounted to approximately \$6.00. This refund amounting to \$5.73 was received in this office and was remitted to KONDO on Aug. 24/43.

We were advised that the T. MATSUYAMA & CO. LTD. owed Mr. Kiechi KONDO the sum of \$600.00. I telephoned P. S. Ross and Sons, who are handling the affairs of this company, and they advise that when the company is liquidated that a distribution will be made to the creditors.

I called at 376 West 4th Avenue and there interviewed the tenant Mrs. Humphries - who informed me that the Kondos prior to their evacuation, moved their chattels from 376 to 344 West 4th Ave.

I note that 344 West 4th Avenue belonged to J.G. Nakashima and everything was moved from this address to Willards Auction Room in November, and sold in Vancouver Auction No. 517.

Without any identification, I can only assume that Kondos' boxes of kitchen utensils were sold under Nakashima's name.

On June 19, 1943, you reported to the Custodian that you had left two boxes of kitchen utensils at 376-4th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. However, when Custodian representative called at 376-4th Avenue, he was informed by Mrs. Humphries, the tenant at 376-4th Avenue, that you had moved your chattels to 344-4th Avenue, West, Vancouver.

The goods shown on the attached list were removed from 344 4th Avenue West and later sold at auction by the Custodian. As Mr. Kotohei ISHIHARA had been renting the premises at 344 4th Avenue West, the goods found there were believed to be his property and were sold in his name.

The funds received from the sale of these goods are being held in Custodian account because it appears that some of the goods were the property of Mr. John Goro NAKASHIMA, owner of the building at 344 West 4th. We have already sent Mr. NAKASHIMA and Mr. ISHIHARA lists of the goods sold with the request that they mark the articles belonging to each of them. We are now sending you a copy of the list of goods sold, and we would suggest that you get in touch with the other two men. Dear Sir;

My father Toyokichi Kondo, who has left for Japan on late 1941 carried an insurance with the Prudential Insurance Co. of America, whose office is located at 510 Hasting St. Vancouver, B.C.

Apparently he has paid his premiums up to February 1942 and the premiums thereafter was detailed to be paid by me. However, the outbreak of war and following with our evacuation. Consequently our present difficult circumstances finds impossible for me to continue paying this premium. For these reason I have instructed my wife on prior to her evacuation to report to you the difficulty concerning this matter and which has done. But unfortunately, this matter presumes to be somehow overlooked, and the insurance has now expired unless we remit the outstanding premiums now amounting to approximate figure of \$ 50.00 .

I am understanding that all property matters concerning Japanese, especially Japanese Nationals as in your jurisdiction Therefore, I am requesting to you the matter be taken immediately so as such insurance be kept in force for the duration.
