PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

January 21, 1946.

Re: Kuyemon IDENOUE #09470

This man signed two declaration to the Custodian, one in May, 1942, the other in July, 1943.

Of the chattels reported in his first declaration, all were found and inventoried by this office, and all have been accounted for either by sale or shipment to him. A few additional items were inventoried by this office, and these too have been accounted for. Chattels sold on behalf of this man realized a net sum of \$180.42. Among the chattels declared in 1943 by this man are three motors, only one of these has been accounted for.

IDENOUE declared a \$50.00 Victory Bond and sixteen \$10.00 War Savings Certificates, as well as a Savings Account of \$1,000.00 in the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings, Vancouver. None of these items came under the control of this office.

His file reveals no other property of any kind.

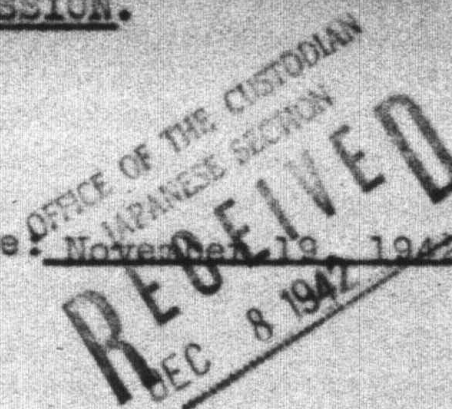

CHATELS SUMMARY

Re: Kuyemon IDENOUYE

Reg. No. 09470

This man, who was evacuated on May 11, 1942, signed two declarations to the Custodian; the first on May 4, 1942, and the second on July 12, 1943.

In his original declaration, he reported a sofa, a washing machine, 3 beds, and two stoves, all of which were sold at auction on September 15, 1943, and an unspecified quantity of kitchen utensils. In regard to the utensils, a trunk of glassware was shipped to this man on May 10, 1943, and one or more wash tubs (which may or may not have contained the kitchen utensils) were shipped to this man with the trunk. It may therefore be assumed that all the chattels he declared to this office in 1942 have been accounted for.

The inventory taken by this office in May and June, 1942, shows the following items, in addition to those declared, an iron board, a bench, an accordion, 28 records, 2 wash tubs and a paper table cover. The iron board and bench were sold September 15, 1943. The accordion and an unspecified number of wash tubs were shipped on May 10, 1943. The table cover was worthless and was discarded. This leaves the 28 records unaccounted for, from the articles found at Woodfibre, and the records are probably still at 604 Cordova Street.

The declaration of July 12, 1943, listed, in addition to the articles mentioned, the iron board, bench and two wash tubs, shown on our inventory and disposed of as stated above; and a hose pipe, an A.C. Motor, a DC-AC radio motor, and a DC Motor Washing Machine. One of the motors, listed as a radio and washing machine motor was inventoried by the Custodian, and we understand that this formed part of the washing machine sold in September, 1943. The two other motors were not inventoried by this office, and we have no knowledge of these at all.

The articles sold at auction on September 15, 1943, brought net proceeds of \$180.42, which have been credited to the account of this man.

Dear Sir:

As requested in your letter of January 3, 1946, we enclose herewith Custodian cheque for the sum of \$185.47, representing all the funds standing to your credit with this office.

In your declaration to the Custodian, May 4, 1942, you reported some kitchen utensils and household effects, stored at Woodfibre. The kitchen utensils were, according to our records contained in the trunk and wash tubs shipped to you in May, 1943. All the other articles declared by you in 1942 were sold at auction by the Custodian, as shown by the list sent to you on October 10, 1944. An inventory of your chattels at Woodfibre taken on May 7, 1942, shows that in addition to the articles declared there were an iron board, a bench, an accordion, 28 records, 2 tubs and a paper table cover. The iron board and bench were sold with the washing machine. The accordion was shipped to you in May, 1943, as were the tubs. The paper table cover was abandoned as valueless. The records are in storage here.

Among the articles reported by you in July, 1943, a hose pipe and two motors were not found among your effects in May, 1942. The other motor was sold as part of the washing machine. It is unfortunate that you did not give us a complete list of your chattels in your original declaration. Had we known of the existence of the hose pipe and two other motors, in 1942, steps could have been taken to trace these.

The Victory Bond, War Saving Certificates and Bank Account, which you reported, did not come under the control of this office.

The sum of \$5.05 was credited to your account as refund of one per cent wage deductions received from the Provincial Government.

The funds being remitted to you are made up of the \$180.42 received from the sale of your chattels and the \$5.05 received from the Provincial Government.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
