

Dear Sir:

In your declaration to the Custodian you stated that you owned no property of any kind left in the Protected Area. Your declaration is dated February 18th, 1943.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police, however, reported that you had surrendered a camera and storage battery. The camera was mailed to you on January 15th, 1946. The storage battery was exhausted and valueless and has been abandoned. The cost of mailing your camera was 21 cents - postage 16 cents and packing cost 5 cents. We are enclosing a 4 cents stamp to cover the balance of the 25 cents you sent to us.

Your account has been credited with the sum of \$50.25 in full settlement of the claim filed by you with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposing Committee for refund of expenses incurred in delivering the vessel "CARLISLE 101" to Naval Services at Steveston, in December, 1941. Cheque for this amount is enclosed.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area, which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience and reply.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 13729

Re: Kichisaburo TAKENAKA

Reg.No. 10973.

On February 18th, 1943, this man signed a declaration stating that he had no property of any kind in the Protected Area. He had written us on December 26th, 1942, stating that the few articles he left in care of Carlisle Cannery, Skeena River, were of too small value to go to any trouble with. In October, 1943, there was delivered to the Custodian, from Carlisle Cannery, one 4 gallon can and one wood box. As nothing further appears on this file in regard to these items it would appear that these were not saleable and have been abandoned. *See memo to Mr. Wells. This reply filed on 1/17/46*

The camera and storage battery, described in the Specified Articles Memorandum, were reported to this office by the R.C.M.P. The storage battery was exhausted and therefore valueless. It has been abandoned. The camera was mailed to TAKENAKA on January 15th, 1946.

The sum of \$50.25 was credited to the account of Kichisaburo TAKENAKA in full settlement of the claim filed with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred in delivering the vessel "CARLISLE 101" to Steveston, in December, 1941, when this vessel was impounded.

The vessel "CARLISLE 101" is dealt with in the Vessels Summary. This vessel was released to the Canadian Fishing Company Limited, who produced proof that she was the property of that company. Although the vessel was apparently in the possession of TAKENAKA, at the time of her impounding, there is no record of any interest of TAKENAKA in this vessel.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
