Dear Sir:

We wish to acknowledge your letter of the 22nd May, and we take this opportunity of giving you a brief summary of our administration of your affairs.

When registering with this office, you declared that you left a boat and engine at Ocean Falls. The boat was sold by the Committee dealing with the liquidation of vessels, for the net sum of \$34.65. The motor was advertised for sale, and was sold to the highest bidder for the sum of \$105.00, against which the sum of \$5.06 was charged for cost of advertising. The proceeds from the sales of these items were credited to your account here, as received.

On the 2nd April, 1945, you informed us of a box, stove and four chairs, which you had left in the care of Mr. Percy at Hammond. In accordance with your request the box was shipped to you, and the expenses incurred in doing this, amounting to \$1.80, were paid from your account here. The stove and chairs were sold at public auction from which the net sum of \$54.15 was derived. This sum was credited to your account.

Your letter of the 3rd April, 1946, informed us of a bed and spring, and roll of carpet left in the house of your father-in-law, Tetsuzo TAKASHIMA. All chattels on his property were sold by auction, and the proceeds from the sale were credited to his account here. Full details of the sale were sent to TAKASHIMA, and he has confirmed that the articles you stated, belonged to you. We have asked him to adjust with you direct the sale price of your goods stored at his place, and we would advise you, therefore, to contact him in this matter.

GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 13734

Re: UTSUNOMIYA, Yasuichi - Reg.No.11317

REGISTRATION: The above Japanese did not register with the Custodian but returned our letter of June 9, 1943 stating on the back of it that he left no property in the protected area except a boat and engine left at Ocean Falls.

LIABILITIES: The only liability referred to on file was a claim of the B. C. Security Commission for \$30.00 covering funeral expenses of an infant son. The account however was cancelled in their letter of July 24, 1945.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: In his letter written on the back of ours of June 9, 1943 he declared he left a boat and engine at Ocean Falls. In his letter of April 2, 1945 he further identified these articles as a boat painted green on top with varnished bottom and the engine as a Johnson Outboard Motor #EA-45595. The boat was disposed of by the Disposal Committee as a Speed Boat 12 feet for \$35.00 less expenses of 35¢.

The motor was advertised for sale by tender at a cost of \$5.06. The highest tender amounting to \$105.00 was accepted by the Custodian and that sum credited to his account here.

This file reveals no other Specified Articles.

CHATELS: In his letter of April 2, 1945 the above Japanese informed us of a wooden box, a stove and four chairs which had been left in the care of A.G.Percy of Hammond, and he requested the box shipped to him at Slocan.

The box was shipped on December 6, 1945 and the charges amounting to \$1.80 were paid from his account here. The stove and chairs were sold at Public Auction on November 16, 1945 for the net sum of \$54.15 which sum was credited to his account here.

In UTSUNOMIYA's letter of April 3, 1946 he stated that he left a bedstead, spring and roll of carpet in the house of his father-in-law, Tetsuzo TAKASHIMA (File #7357). Indentification of these goods is not possible here and it will be necessary for the two of them to make some satisfactory adjustment between themselves. Both are being so advised and TAKASHIMA is being sent copies of our Auction results which were credited to his account here.

This file reveals no other assets or liabilities nor does the file of his wife (File #6104) which has already been closed.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

MEMORANDUM TO FILE 13734

March 21, 1944.

Re: Yasuichi UTSUNOMIYA, Reg. 11317

This man was the owner of a 12 foot speed boat, which was left with Provincial Police at Ocean Falls. The engine of this boat, a Johnson Outboard, Model H.A.10, Serial No. 45595, 2.5 H.P. (1940) was seized by Naval Service. OK

This boat was sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for \$35.00. From this amount the Boat #13 JFVDC deducted 35 cents commission, and turned the balance over to the Custodian. The balance of \$34.65 was credited to the account of Yasuichi UTSUNOMIYA.

The engine was turned over to the Custodian in April, 1943, and has been sold (Engine 106). The net proceeds of this sale have been credited to Yasuichi UTSUNOMIYA's account. The sale price of this engine was \$105.00.
