Dear Sir:

As requested by you in your letter of the 16th ultimo, we are enclosing herewith Custodian cheque in the amount of \$86.06, representing all funds remaining to your credit in this office.

As this remittance closes your account with the Custodian, your file has been reviewed and the following information revealed.

Although you declared no property of any kind belonging to you remaining in the protected area, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported to this office that a radio and three cameras had been surrendered by you. This was confirmed by the receipt which you sent to this office on September 16th.

The radio was sold by the Custodian, as you were advised previously, and the net proceeds of \$86.21 credited to your account.

The three cameras were mailed to you on September 22nd, 1945, and should be in your hands by the time this letter reaches you. The cost of mailing was 15 cents, which was charged to your account.

In March, 1943, the Custodian received a cheque, in the amount of \$72.96, from the Registrar of War Savings Certificates, payable to you, and on April 7th, 1943, at your request, this sum was remitted to you, at Princeton.

It is felt that we have accounted for all property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this, and acknowledge receipt of the cameras and the enclosed cheque, we are attaching a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

October 1, 1945.

Re: Yoshisuke MURATA, Reg. No. 04861

This man was evacuated on March 10, 1942. No declaration regarding his assets was signed by him prior to his evacuation.

On March 24, 1943, the Custodian received a cheque for \$72.96 from the Registrar of War Savings Certificates, payable to Yoshisuke MURATA, and on that date a letter was sent to MURATA, enclosing a JP form. He returned the JP form with a letter stating that he had no property remaining in the protected area. The letter carried the name Yoshisuke MURATA, Reg. No. 04861, typewritten, but no signature.

At MURATA's request, the \$72.96 was remitted to him on April 7, 1943.

The cameras and radio, shown on Specified Articles Memorandum, were reported by the RCMP as having been surrendered by this man. The radio was sold and the net proceeds credited to his account in the amount of \$86.21. The cameras were mailed to Yoshisuke MURATA on September 22, 1945. In proof of his ownership, he sent us the receipt which he had received from the RCMP when these articles were surrendered.

This file reveals no evidence of ownership of a vessel, motor-vehicle or fire-arm.

This file reveals no evidence of ownership of any other personal property of any kind whatsoever.
