Dear Sir:

We have been advised by the Department of Labour, Immigration Division, that the above named deceased, was prior to emigration resident at 1077 Quebec Street, New Westminster, died on July 6, 1941, in New Jersey, N. J., and we are willing to request that you kindly advise the administration of his estate.

We are enclosing herewith copy of a letter received from the widow, Mrs. Sara Thompson, together with a list of particulars furnished by her, the original will in Japanese, and a certified copy of an Italian translation.

Our file indicates that the deceased was married twice and left him surviving the following:

Children by his first wife, who is deceased:

1. Mrs. Emma THOMPSON, daughter, c/o Hart & Peterson, Winnipeg, N. C., aged 24 years.

We are informed by the U.S.I.P., that the above named survivors were either born in Canada or became naturalized Canadians with the exception

of Mrs. Emma Taira, Mrs. Mitsuo Tachibana, and Yoshiyo Teramoto,
the late Japanese Nationals.

Amount of the demand, of which we have knowledge, is
a credit balance with the Government, amounting to \$233.41.

We have on file a claim of Messrs. N. Nishiguchi Company
limited for \$249.75 for merchandise supplied prior to evacuation
and during the years 1940, 1941 and 1942. This firm states that
they have a demand note, dated May 9, 1943, covering this indebted-
ness and also have an acknowledgment from him to the effect that he
received certain goods.

You will note that in the original memorandum of
particulars, dated September 1, 1945, that Mrs. Teramoto under 11 (2)
reads as follows:

"This is an understanding between myself and the creditor this matter is
to be ignored, therefore I have signed it."

We are not certain, but this may refer to the matter outlined in Mrs.
Teramoto's letter, dated August 21, 1945, a copy of which we are
attaching hereto for your information.

We will be pleased to have you advise us as to your willing-
ness to act in this matter and what letters of Administration have been
issued to you, kindly forward a certified copy to this office, so that
we may verify the facts and be our hands.
