GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 13784

May 19, 1947.

Taichiro HATTORI died at Mission, B. C. on June 22, 1931. He is survived by his widow, Sumi, file #2857; five sons, Masao, file #2855, Sakio, file #2717, Yoshio, file #2711, Haruo, file #2713, and Tami, a minor; and three daughters, Kimiko, not registered, Sakiko, file #2741, and Nobuko, file #2709.

A file was opened in this office for this deceased Japanese when it was found that real property in the Village of Mission was registered in his name. The estate of the deceased had been Administered by W. D. Carter, at that time Official Administrator for the Vancouver District and all assets of the deceased had been distributed. The real property is, therefore, administered on the file of the widow, Sumi, file #2857.

The only asset of the deceased which came under the control of the Custodian was a refund of security deposit for light in the amount of \$3.28 received for his credit from the B. C. Electric Railway Company. This sum was forwarded to the widow on May 3, 1947.

No claims against the deceased appear on this file.
