PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

No Specified Articles belonging to the above Japanese person are revealed on this file.

Chattels:

On May 10, 1943 JP registration forms were sent to ISEZAKI for completion and in his reply dated May 17, 1943 Isezaki advised that he was unable to give full particulars so would not send back the forms but that he had left his belongings at home and did not know what happened to them. The Custodian advised him on December 28, 1943 to fill in and return to us our Yellow NO PROPERTY card if he had no property remaining in the protected area except the personal property already registered by his mother. This was duly completed under date of January 12, 1944. A check of his mother's file, 10467, does not reveal any chattels in the name of Kiyoharu ISEZAKI, and no further reference has been made to personal property on this file.

War Savings Stamps and
Back Wages:

According to a statement of assets and liabilities submitted by Isezaki while interned at Angler, Ontario, this Japanese stated that \$150.00 back wages were due to him from Terminal Lumber Co., Vancouver, and that this Company also held for him about \$4.00 in War Saving Stamps. Mr. K. W. Wright wrote to the above Company in August 1942 regarding the above two items asking that they remit to us their cheque for \$150.00, together with \$4.00 worth of War Savings Stamps if the above statement coincided with their records. There is nothing on file to indicate that the above amount was received and no further correspondence in this connection appears on file. Our records reveal that there are no funds in connection with the Terminal Lumber Company which was previously owned by three Japanese - Files 8457, 10818 and 11188, but that the Company has debts amounting to more than \$2500.00).

According to a memo on file dated August 13, 1942 the sum of \$17.52 was credited to Isezaki's account with the Custodian, representing wages owing to Isezaki for the month of June 1942 while at Red Pass, B. C. This cheque was received by us from the Department of Mines and Resources. At Isezaki's request the above amount was forwarded to him at Angler, Ontario, in care of the Camp Commandant.

Angler Internment Camp, Angler, Ontario.

Upon your release you will proceed directly to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway and will report yourself to Mr. C. A. Gardner at Gravel, Ontario, as follows: Immediately on your arrival and will enter his employment in accordance with your agreement so to do.

The following are herewith delivered to you:

- (1) Haversack rations sufficient for your journey to your destination.
- (2) Copies of all Undertakings signed by you as conditions of your release.
- (3) All effects delivered by you to any officer or soldier of any camp or station in which you have been held, with the exception of such articles as have been previously returned to you or as have been noted as missing on Form I.O. 10 "Inventory of Prisoner's Effects".
- (4) The balance of all funds held in trust for you by the Camp Commandant.
- (5) Second-class transportation from Angler to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway will be provided.

You are hereby warned to register yourself as required by the National Registration Act at the Post Office in the vicinity of your place of residence.
