In reply to your letter, 767, dated the 23rd July, relative to one P/W A-28 Hayashi, Hidekazu, interned in the Internment Camp at Angler, Ontario, and who is thought to be a Post Office Savings Bank depositor according to a statement of his assets and liabilities which shows a cash balance of \$1.00 in a Post Office Savings Account, I regret to have to say that the particulars given by you have not made it possible to identify the account in question.

Will you please be good enough to ascertain the number of the passbook and the Post Office at which it was issued. Also, please ascertain whether the internee may have used a variation in the name given by you in opening his account.

An envelope is enclosed for your reply giving the additional particulars required when the matter will be further dealt with.

Upon your release you will proceed directly to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway and will report yourself to Mr. C. A. Gardner at Gravel, Ontario, as follows:

Immediately on your arrival and will enter his employment in accordance with your agreement so to do.

The following are herewith delivered to you:

- (1) Haversack rations sufficient for your journey to your destination.
- (2) Copies of all Undertakings signed by you as conditions of your release.
- (3) All effects delivered by you to any officer or soldier of any camp or station in which you have been held, with the exception of such articles as have been previously returned to you or as have been noted as missing on Form I.O. 10 "Inventory of Prisoner's Effects".
- (4) The balance of all funds held in trust for you by the Camp Commandant.
- (5) Second-class transportation from Angler to Gravel, Ontario, by Canadian Pacific Railway will be provided.

You are hereby warned to register yourself as required by the National Registration Act at the Post Office in the vicinity of your place of residence.
