We are in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, and note that you wish us to remit all the funds at your credit with this office.

We may remind you however, that some time ago you asked the Custodian to re-pay to S. INOUYE the sum of \$150.00 which you had borrowed from him. The Department of Labour, at the time however, did not agree to this, and we withheld this payment.





SET FOR.....

1. The above named is at present in custody at the Canadian Immigration Detention Sheds, having been arrested as an alien enemy. He is 46 years old and works as a millhand at the Alto Lake Camp of the Fernie Lumber Co. Godo lives with his wife in a shack near the camp and his assets in this respect amount to about \$200.

2. The writer interviewed this man on Dec. 15th, at the Canadian Immigration Detention Shed in an effort to obtain information as to his assets or otherwise which might prove of assistance to the custodian of enemy alien property in the administration of this man's affairs.

3. This man is somewhat illiterate and barely speaks Japanese and no English. He was interviewed with the assistance of an interpreter. Among his effects at the time of his arrest was a bank book showing an account with the East End Branch of the Bank of Montreal No. 1489 with a balance of \$331.03. He has no safety deposit box. His wife has an account with the Japan & Canada Trust Savings Co. with a balance of about \$50.

4. Subject has a fully paid Victory Bond (\$100.) at his home. He owns one acre of land in Japan but has no property elsewhere with the exception of the shack at the camp mentioned in paragraph one. He states that he is free from debt but that his boss, Y. Takimata, borrowed \$500. from him in February or March of this year.

5. An effort will be made to verify the information contained above with the cooperation of the custodian of enemy alien property.

Dear Sirs:

Re: Moichi Godo, Alto Lake Camp

I am advised that the above party was employed by you at the Alto Lake Camp and that he has now been detained. His assets are, therefore, vested in the Custodian and, since it appears that he has a wife who will have to be maintained, the Custodian is anxious to locate the assets and see that she is properly cared for.

The information which I have indicates that his camp boss, Y. Takimoto, owes him \$500.00. I presume that this party is employed by you and would greatly appreciate if you could ascertain whether or not this is correct. If it is correct, then Mr. Takimoto should deposit this money in a bank to the credit of the detained party.

This party's wife should be advised that the Custodian will allow her to use her husband's assets for her maintenance.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This Japanese person was interned, and released December 22, 1942.

He did not make a declaration but the Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported his financial position on December 15, 1941 as follows:

"GODO lives with his wife in a shack near the Camp (Fernridge Lumber Co.) and his assets in this respect amount to about \$200.00. The file reveals no further information in regards to this".

BANK  
ACCOUNT :

Among his effects at the time of his arrest was a bank book showing an account with the East End Branch of the Bank of Montreal, No. 1489, balance \$331.03. Interest of \$2.35 was added to this, making a total of \$333.08. From time to time cheques were drawn against this account by GODO for the maintenance of his wife and on May 22, 1942 the balance of his credit \$33.10 was forwarded to the Custodian by the Bank of Montreal.

MONEYS  
OWING :

The Fernridge Lumber Co. of Haney owed \$500.00 to Moichi GODO for a loan made to them and this was repaid on June 18, 1942 by Messrs. Tiffin, Russel, DeMoulin, & Brown solicitors for the company.

The Custodian, from time to time made payments to Mrs. GODO against this for her maintenance.



BONDS:

A \$100.00 Victory Bond in Moichi GODO's possession was surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and handed to the Custodian on February 10, 1942. Accrued interest of \$13.50 was credited to his account and the Bond cashed at his request. The proceeds \$107.10 was credited to Moichi GODO. GODO's subscription of \$6.00 to two \$5.00 War Savings Certificates was refunded to his wife Kimi by the Fernridge Lumber Co.
