GENERAL SUMMARY

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on July 24, 1943. He was then in Vernon, B. C., having been evacuated on March 3, 1942. He died at Vernon on December 23, 1946.

In his declaration ISE reported ownership of no property of any kind in the protected area.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported that this man had surrendered a radio. On October 13, 1944, the police informed this office that the radio had been sold to Hardit SINGH, 2526 Government St., Victoria by Mrs. Keiji ISE, apparently prior to the surrender of radios. As this radio was not among those turned over to the Custodian, it would appear that it must have been released to Hardit SINGH by the R.C.M.P.

This man carried life insurance with the Prudential Insurance Company of America. On February 5, 1947, cheque for \$1,078.96 representing settlement of claim under policies #M4326188 and M4526190 were made to Mrs. Masue ISE, widow of Keiji ISE, and beneficiary under the policies.

A claim was filed against Keiji ISE by Drs. Kenning & Kenning, of Victoria, in the amount of \$35.00. On February 11, 1947, Mrs. Masue ISE (File 2929) informed this office that she would settle this claim from her husband's insurance money.

This file reveals no other assets or liabilities.
