This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on March 30/43 and was evacuated on March 16/42, declared only specified articles, as follows:

- 1 Midget radio
- 1 Miller radio (no cabinet)
- 1 Folding camera
- 1 Motion picture camera

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

The Miller radio was delivered to us as Radio International (chassis only - no cabinet) and this was sold at auction for the net sum of \$14.96, and this sum credited to the account of the above with the Custodian.

The folding camera No. 2Premo was delivered by the R.C.M.P. to us in Aug., 1944, and was mailed to the above on Jan. 23/46.

The motion picture camera (Stewart Warner) was delivered to us by the R.C.M.P. on April 16/44, but this camera was stolen from our warehouse at 992 Powell St., Vancouver, and JINDE was duly advised of this in our letter to him of Dec. 18/45.

The Midget radio was not received by us from the R.C.M.P. JINDE in his letter of March 9/46 states that he delivered two radios to the R.C.M.P. He lost the R.C.M.P. receipt which would have proved his assertion, and then gave us a statutory declaration for one radio only. The R.C.M.P. receipt dated Jan. 25/44 shows one radio only delivered to the Custodian.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.


We have contacted the above person again, and have obtained full particulars regarding his radio and photographic equipment. You state that disposition of all his articles have been fully covered in your letters to Mr. Jinde dated December 18th, 1945 and January 18th, 1946.

In reply to your further enquiries regarding the above mentioned article, as we previously advised you, this was stolen from our warehouse.

We have taken all reasonable measures for protection of personal goods, involving considerable expense in the employment of caretakers, watchmen and night patrol, but in spite of this a certain amount of breaking-in and vandalism has occurred in our storage from time to time resulting in some items being stolen. It would appear that your camera might have been taken under such circumstances.

Burglary and theft are, of course, circumstances which sometimes happen to the most careful property owners, even when the owner is in residence and after taking every precaution against such possibilities.

The police have been made aware of this situation and if the missing article should be recovered you will of course be advised.

We have your letter of the 11th instant and in reply would inform you that the file of Tadao JINDE is now under review for the purpose of effecting remittance to him of his credit with this office and closing his account.

His Stewart Warner motion picture camera was stolen and he has been so advised. We have addressed him again on the subject today, a copy of which is enclosed for your record.

Mr. JINDE, through a Statutory Declaration asserted that he had surrendered a mantel radio to the Custodian, this declaration being made before you on January 5th, 1946. The radios according to law were surrendered not to the Custodian, but to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, so that under the circumstances his declaration is incorrect as the R.C.M.P. handed his radio set to us and it was sold at public auction for the net sum of \$14.96, and this amount credited to his account.

It is noted that the date on which Mr. JINDE surrendered his radio to the R.C.M.P. was March 10th, 1942, but when Mr. JINDE registered with the Custodian on March 30th, 1942, he declared ownership of two radio sets.

Before closing his file we shall require to know what he did with the second radio, as from his Statutory declaration he had one radio only, and as he was quite aware, all radios were to be surrendered to the police.


