Dear Sir:

Your letter of November 26, 1946, has been received. We do not understand your letter.

On August 5, 1946, we informed you that the radio surrendered by you had been sold for the net sum of \$20.33, and that the camera surrendered by you was in the hands of the Custodian. We informed you that, if you would send us the receipt given to you at the time the camera and radio were surrendered, we would send you the camera and, after deducting the cost of shipping the camera, we would send you the balance of the funds from the sale of the radio.

On August 15, 1946, you informed this office that you had been unable to find the receipt for the radio and camera. You asked for the balance of your funds and for the return of your camera.

On August 19, 1946, we sent you a Statutory Declaration form in regard to the lost receipt. This Declaration, signed before a Notary Public, was returned to this office. The Declaration, signed on the 22nd of August, 1946, states that you had surrendered the radio and camera; that you received a receipt; that you had searched for the receipt but were unable to find it; that the only reason for the non-production of the receipt was that it had been lost or destroyed; that you were now entitled to the return of your camera and to the proceeds of the sale of the radio; that you wished the cost of mailing the camera to be deducted from the proceeds of the sale of the radio.

Your signed Declaration was accepted by this office in lieu of the missing receipt, and on September 5, 1946, the camera was sent to you by insured parcel post. The mailing costs were 31 cents, postage of 26 cents and a five cent packing charge, which were charged to your account with this office. On September 7, 1946, we sent you by registered mail Custodian cheque for \$20.02, which was the amount remaining to your credit.

On September 18, 1946, we received your letter acknowledging that you had received the camera and the cheque.

Since you have received your camera and the money from the sale of your radio, we are unable to understand your letter of November 26, 1946.

On February 1, 1943, this man signed a declaration to the Custodian in which he stated that he owned no property of any kind whatsoever.

The RCMP reported a radio and camera surrendered by this man, however. The radio was sold for the net sum of \$20.33, which has been remitted to KODAIRA. The camera was returned to KODAIRA on September 5, 1946. He has acknowledged receipt of both camera and cheque sent to him on September 7, 1946.

The goods reported in anonymous letter received September 8, 1944, appear to have been shipped out of the protected area by Rev. Gale of Holy Cross Anglican Church. These did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property.

This file and the file of Mrs. Muneo KODAIRA, File 14990, reveal no liabilities.
